First of all, thank you for taking the time to read and address this letter. My reason for this letter seems to be because of a misunderstanding between A-Justice Bail Bonds and the Collin County Bail Bond Board. When I went through the process of qualifying to be a Bondsman in this county I used real property as collateral and I was approved and so the property was also, I was told the county would carry the deed. I was told to take the deed to the Treasurer to complete my obligation to the county before I opened up. I did this and it was accepted by her. Now nearly two months later I find out that transferring the deed to the county was not the way it was supposed to be. Instead, I was supposed to supply a deed of trust to the treasurer. Although the county still legally has my property we have been told to stop writing bonds until it can be filed properly. Property is a 22.3ac. tract out of Van Zandt County Named; from, Michele Price to Collin County as a Warranty Deed.

With this letter I am supplying a warranty deed, that needs commissioners to signed and returned to me. Then I can redo that deed into a deed of trust which has to happen in order to open back up.

So, if the commissioners can sign and notarize my deed back over to me, today, then I can complete the requests of the Bail Bond board within a day. The Bail Bond Board is aware of this letter and transaction.
