Texas Prisoner Transport Division COMPANY PROFILE

Texas Prisoner Transport Division, LLC is headquartered in Taylor, Texas and provides nationwide ground and air prisoner transport available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and 365 days a year. TPTD is a certified Historically Underutilized Business. TPTD is qualified to transport any classification of prisoner.

Interstate Transportation of Dangerous Criminals Act of 2000

Texas Prisoner Transport Division complies with all regulations governed by the Interstate Transportation of Dangerous Criminals Act of 2000 (Jenna's Act).

United States Department of Transportation

Texas Prisoner Transport Division transports prisoners nationwide under the authority of the United States Department of Transportation (DOT), Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA). TPTD's USDOT number is 2209282. TPTD complies with all requirements for limits on continuous travel, hours and miles as governed by the Department of Transportation.

Vehicles

Texas Prisoner Transportation Division has a fleet of Full Size vans, Mini vans, and sedans. Our vans and sedans are compartmentalized and specially modified to provide the maximum security and separations of prisoners. All vehicles are caged and properly equipped for prisoner transports. The steel compartments have been designed to maximize security while providing quick access to remove the inmates in the event of an emergency. All vehicles have operational heater and air conditioning, have welded steel screens to cover the windows, and the doors and windows are unable to be opened from the inside of the prisoner section. Restraints including handcuffs, leg irons, waist chains, and interconnect chains are carried on board. Additional equipment includes prisoner clothing, road triangles, CPR shields, First Aid kits, fire extinguishers, cell phones and blankets.

All vehicles comply and are applicable to United States Department of Transportation regulations. All vehicles are in good and safe operating conditions and are current with registration and licenses.

TPTD utilizes ASE-certified mechanics to maintain its vehicles in our seventeen bay shop. Preventative maintenance programs are in place to ensure safety and maximized operations.

Employee Uniforms & Identification

All TPTD employees involved in the transport of prisoners are required by TPTD policy to wear company-issued uniforms bearing the company logo and to carry identification that includes company name, employee name, photograph, and signature.



Meals

As mandated by the American Correctional Association Standard 4-44328 inmates are provided three (3) nutritionally adequate meals daily. All efforts are made to insure meals meet dietary needs and/or religious preference.

Training

The foundation of TPTD's operation is the safe, secure and reliable transportation of prisoners. To ensure that this is achieved on each and every transport, all Texas Prisoner Transportation Division's transportation agents are required to complete the most rigorous and comprehensive training program in the industry.

All transportation agents must successfully complete our initial training program. All trainees are certified in First Aid, CPR, blood and airborne pathogens, firearms, and use of force during their basic training.

Following initial training, each transportation agent will complete on the job training under the supervision of specially trained personnel. This on-the-job training continues the practical application of the information presented during training.

In addition to initial training, TPTD requires its transportation specialists to successfully complete 40 hours of annual in-service training in order to continue their employment.

Training programs cover a variety of subjects including:

- Sexual harassment/PREA
- Ethics
- Professionalism
- Prisoner transportation
- Map reading
- Use of force
- Interpersonal communications skills
- Prisoner rights

Certification courses – such as American Red Cross CPR and First Aid, National Rifle Association Certified Shotgun Course, National Safety Council Certified Driving Training. Each transportation agent receives certificates of these accomplishments after successful completion of the training program. The initial training is conducted at TPTD headquarters in Taylor, TX.

COLLIN COUNTY REQUIREMENTS

4.9.1 Have in place an operational ground transportation system that operates twenty-four (24) hours per day, seven (7) days per week, three-hundred and sixty-five (365) days per year.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and three hundred and sixty five days of the year.

4.9.2 Provide a copy of the certificate issued by the Interstate Commerce Commission, which gives them authority to operate as a common carrier.

RESPONSE: The ICC is no longer the governing body of prisoner transportation. The Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) grants authority to operate as a common carrier. Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.

4.9.3 Provide at least two (2) officers to each vehicle or aircraft transporting a prisoner. Provider will furnish qualified female personnel when possible when transporting female prisoners. All drivers and 5 transport officers shall be trained and licensed to carry firearms in accordance with all State and Federal requirements.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.

4.9.4 If engaged in the air transportation business, show proper documentation of the security officers' training and experience in handling air transport of prisoners.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.

4.9.5 Provide an updated list of Transport Personnel upon request of the Sheriff or his designated representative.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.

4.9.6 Provide vehicles that are currently licensed and shall remain licensed at all times. These vehicles must be equipped with heat and air conditioning for the entire vehicle. These vehicles must be equipped with mobile communications, and be in good operating condition.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.

4.9.7 When aircraft are utilized, insure that they meet the approval of the Federal Aviation Administration. All aircraft pilots must be properly licensed and all aircraft will be operated according to applicable Federal Aviation Regulations.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.



4.9.8 Assume custody of prisoners within ten (10) days of notification by the County.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.

4.9.9 Secure prisoners in their custody with restraining devices that secure their hands in front to waist chain or similar type device. Legs will be secured with leg irons or similar type leg restraint device. Said restraining devices shall be utilized immediately upon accepting custody of the prisoner(s) and removed only after the receiving agency has applied similar restraints or placed the prisoner in a secure facility or location.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.

4.9.10 In the event the driver or pilot in command determines that a prisoner's condition or behavior is dangerous to the safety of the vehicle or aircraft, or its passengers, notify the County's Fugitive Division supervisor on duty, immediately, prior to leaving the pick-up location, and there shall be no charge to the County.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.

4.9.11 In the event the Provider incurs inclement weather, mechanical failure, or any other situation which results in a delay, provide food, lodging, or any other necessity for the prisoner(s), or when necessary, lodging of the prisoner(s) at an appropriate law enforcement detention facility. The Sheriff, or his designated representative, must be immediately notified of any such delay.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.

4.9.12 Upon arriving at the receiving agency, surrender custody of the prisoner to the designated agency or agent after first confirming identification of the officers or agent of said agency.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.

4.9.13 Provide a written report of any and all unusual incidents, emergencies, medical care, and controversial situations that involve prisoners being transported for the County.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.

4.10 Approximate Usage: On average, Collin County arranges transport for approximately 71 prisoners annually. Approximate usage does not constitute an order, but only implies the probable quantity the County will use.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.



4.11 Minimum Requirements:

4.11.1 Insurance requirements as stated herein.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transportation Division would like to take an exception to the requirement of Commercial Automobile Liability in the amount of five million dollars. To be in compliance with the FMCSA, vendors are required to carry Automobile Liability: If transporting in a vehicle rated for 15 passengers or less, minimum coverage of one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000) per occurrence combined single limit for automobile liability and property damage. Since TPTD utilizes vehicles that are less than 15 passenger. TPTD maintains one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000).

4.11.2 Bidder shall provide with bid response an affidavit of performance showing that a minimum of one thousand (1,000) prisoners were moved by bidder during the last twelve (12) months.

RESPONSE: In the last 12 months Texas Prisoner Transport Division as transported over 2100 prisoners. 84% was male, 15% was female, and 1% was juveniles.

4.11.3 Transport personnel qualifications: Bidder shall provide transport personnel who meet all of the following minimum qualifications:

4.11.3.1 All transport personnel shall be physically and mentally sound;

4.11.3.2 Transport personnel shall be free of any serious hearing impairment and shall have good visual capacity;

4.11.3.3 Transport personnel shall have had training and/or instruction in all of the following areas:

4.11.3.3.1 First aid, including CPR

4.11.3.3.2 Public relations

4.11.3.3.3 Safety

4.11.3.3.4 Proper use of written report forms

4.11.3.3.5 Security procedures and techniques

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.

4.11.3.4 Vendor shall submit a letter of confirmation within ten (10) days after award certifying that it will provide a drug free work place in complete compliance with the Drug-Free Work Place Act of 1988, 28 CFR Part 67, Subpart F, and Collin County Commissioners' Court Order No. 90-455-06-11. Chemical screening will be required for all employees performing work for the County. These records will be made available for inspection upon request. Non-compliance may be grounds for removal of individual from service and/or termination of vendor's contract.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.

4.11.3.5 Transport personnel shall be neat and clean in attire and person, and be in uniform while on duty.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.



4.11.4 Vendor shall provide all necessary equipment and vehicle(s) to transport personnel which may be required in the performance of their duties. Equipment and vehicles shall be in good operating condition.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.

4.11.5 Vendor's vehicles shall be modified for the transportation of prisoners.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.

4.11.6 All reasonable precautions shall be taken for the safety and well-being of prisoners during transportation.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.

4.11.7 Bidder shall specify how transportation will be accomplished (van, commercial airline, double-guard, etc.).

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.

4.11.8 Vendor shall pay the transport personnel furnished for the contract not less than minimum wage established by Federal and State laws.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.

4.11.9 Transport personnel shall separate male and female prisoners while being transported.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.

4.11.10 Vendor shall report all medical expenditures to the Collin County Sheriff's Office in detail, with documentation.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.

4.11.11 Vendor must feed prisoners three (3) meals per day, one of which is a hot meal, when the prisoner(s) are in custody of the vendor for more than a twenty-four (24) hour period.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.

4.11.12 Vendor shall be required to pay all medical costs, including transportation to and from any medical facility to the provider. The costs will be reimbursed to the vendor by Collin County provided that all medical expenses are documented with receipts.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.



4.11.13 All costs associated with transporting prisoners, except medical costs, shall be included in the bid price.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.

4.11.14 Collin County reserves the right to remove transport personnel if deemed unacceptable by Collin County Sheriff's Office.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.

4.11.15 Documentation: Vendor shall maintain complete and accurate records for all prisoners to substantiate services provided to Collin County, including but not limited to the following:

4.11.15.1 Prisoners extradition waiver forms

4.11.15.2 Personal property control forms

4.11.15.3 Medical information forms

4.11.15.4 Prisoner receipt forms

4.11.15.5 Scheduling information indicating that prisoners are always rested in detention facilities for a minimum of eight (8) hours during each twenty-four (24) hour period while being transported.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.

4.11.15.6 Meal schedules indicating that prisoners are provided three (3) meals during each twenty-four (24) hour period while being transported.

RESPONSE: Texas Prisoner Transport Division acknowledges and agrees to comply with this requirement.
