Need to address MB Roads, before we add other projects.

I had a meeting with our engineer yesterday and nailed down we wanted to include three street projects using our first outlay of GO Bond money. The projects are:

1. Sycamore Street Panel Replacement (Hwy 78 to Jackson) - *CONCRETE?*
2. CR557 (US 380 to SH 78) Overlay - *MB ROAD*
3. Hamilton Street (Yucca to Gaddy) Overlay - *TRIP & H.M.A.L.?*

As you can see, item 2 is one of the joint projects we talked about earlier this year. We are committed to support the CR557 project (item 2) with \$4,583.04 of GO Bond funds based on an estimate you provided earlier this year. Our funding should become available in September of this year.

If you don't mind, give me an estimate of when you think the CR557 project will be scheduled.

Right now the Orange Street Project is on hold pending a decision and support from City Council. There may not be enough Council support for this project at this time. Their belief is our funds would be better spent on other areas of our City. If you have an argument that would suggest otherwise please let me know and I will go to bat for you or perhaps you would like to support your position in front of Council. If I remember right you were going to use our available Collin County matching funds (from other future project like Farmersville Parkway, CR611) regardless if we did not support the project with cash out of pocket.

Item 3, the Hamilton Street project is an asphalt overlay project. Are you still willing to help me with this if supply the funds and pay you to do the work. If so, can you provide me with the numbers it will take to estimate the project using that beast of a machine y'all have? Can you pencil us in to do this project in October/November of this year? We are very serious about going forward quickly. I can provide more details if you let me know what you need.
