YOU ARE HEREBY DIRECTED TO MAKE CHANGES TO THE REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ATTACHED INFORMATION.

DELETE:

5.47 Provider shall provide the dental program for the entire inmate/juvenile population. The program shall provide for basic dental services, including extraction, and fillings. Emergency dental services shall be available on a 24-hour-a-day basis. Dental screening shall be given to each inmate/juvenile by a nurse within fourteen (14) calendar days of his or her admission to the Detention Facility, but must be examined by a licensed dentist within ninety (90) days. A dental screening shall include charting decayed, missing and filled teeth, and taking a dental history of the inmate/juvenile; a dental record shall be maintained as part of the medical record of the inmate/juvenile. Annual dental examinations shall be performed on each inmate. Services provided for juveniles shall be on-site.

REPLACE WITH:

5.47 Provider shall provide the dental program for the entire inmate/juvenile population. The program shall provide for basic dental services, including extraction, and fillings. Provider shall meet the compliance indicators in accordance to the National Commission on Correctional Healthcare standards for Health Services in Jail Oral Care (J-E-06). Emergency dental services shall be available on a 24-hour-a-day basis. Dental screening shall be given to each inmate/juvenile by a nurse within fourteen (14) calendar days of his or her admission to the Detention Facility. A dental screening shall include charting decayed, missing and filled teeth, and taking a dental history of the inmate/juvenile; a dental

record shall be maintained as part of the medical record of the inmate/juvenile. Annual dental examinations shall be performed on each inmate. Services provided for juveniles shall be on-site.

QUESTIONS:

QUESTION: 5.60, 5.65 and 5.72 are they referring to the same person?

ANSWER: Yes

QUESTION: Can a vendor submit alternate proposals?

ANSWER: Yes, as long as they submit a proposal with the Collin County base requirements.

QUESTION: Collin County was last accredited in June 2010. When is the next accreditation?

ANSWER: Just received new accreditation in April 2013.

QUESTION: Is Juvenile accredited?

ANSWER: No

QUESTIONS: 5.47 Dental Screening. It says nurse 14 day, Dentist charting of teeth 90 day.

ANSWER: See Addendum #1

QUESTION: Is it County's intent to select 1 vendor?

ANSWER: Yes

QUESTION: What software is being used for medical records?

ANSWER: CorEMR.

QUESTION: Is the vendor responsible for all services described in the RFP?

ANSWER: Yes

QUESTION: 5.20, where is mental health for juveniles handled?

ANSWER: Onsite at the Juvenile Facility.

QUESTION: What providers does Collin County use for Hospital, Lab, and Pharmacy?

ANSWER: Hospital -- Baylor of McKinney, Parkland, and Medical Center of McKinney; Lab -- LabCorp; Pharmacy -- current vendor.

QUESTION: Is syphilis testing required?

ANSWER: It is offered.

QUESTION: What is the requirement for the juveniles facility regarding standards?

ANSWER: The Texas Juvenile Department typically audits annually to see that we are complying with TAC 343 standards.

QUESTION: What was your current population on 5/28/13? Male and Female.

ANSWER: Main jail: 724 Males and 134 Females, Minimum Jail: 66 Males and 27 Females, Juvenile: 68 Males and 13 Females.

QUESTION: Are mental health issues handled in the infirmary?

ANSWER: Yes mental health issues are in the infirmary.

QUESTION: Where is suicide watch?

ANSWER: Levels 1&2 are in the infirmary, Level 3 is in the housing unit.

QUESTION: Is there a cap that vendors can use for maximum population?

ANSWER: Juvenile at 110 and the Jail at 990. A total cap at 1100.

QUESTION: How are the medications given in the main jail?

ANSWER: A routine medicine pass is issued in the pods. There are on occasions that meds are issued in the infirmary or medical satellite.
