Within the email attached below Mr. Louis Pollaehn requests relief from dusty conditions resulting from heavy traffic on CR398 traveling to and from Harper Elementary School. As Mr. Pollaehn indicates, we have had difficulty in acquiring right-of-way needed to widen and pave CR398 which would be of benefit to all motorists.

Our county policy provides dust control oil be applied to the road adjacent to the Pollaehn's residence one time per year which we completed this past spring. That said, and in an effort to make CR398 safer for all motorists we are inquiring to see if Princeton ISD would be interested in cost participation to oil all of CR398. The total estimate to apply dust control oil to all of CR398 is \$4,310.

If you will let me know PISD's intentions I would be most appreciative and will respond accordingly.

Dear Mr. Kleinheksel,

As you know, school is about to start. Since school opened at Harper Elementary School last year the traffic, the dust and the speeders have been unbearable to those of us who live on County Road 398. We are about to face this same dilemma again. The road is a white rock road that gets oiled two or three times a year. Traffic is comprised of many dozens of parents, in a big hurry to get their kids to school on time, school busses, teachers, school employees and delivery trucks. The dust that is generated by this continuous traffic is often so thick that I can't see oncoming traffic when I try to pull out of my driveway in the mornings. Not to mention the dust that settles in and around my home because the oiling is effective for only a few days. Oiling stops at the entrance to my driveway instead of past my house which is about 300 feet east of the driveway entrance. My wife has chronic asthma and we have a certificate on file with you. I would expect that the County would do more to improve the conditions of County Road 398 with the school located only a mile or so down our road. I do not even see our road on the asphaltting list. I know that there is resistance from certain residents along our road to giving up right of way in order to widen the road. Their position is, "why not ask the land owners along the north side of the road to give up ROW since they don't have homes there". Also, they are under no discomfort because their part of the road is always covered with more oil and traffic moves much slower through that narrow part of the road. Commissioner Joe Jaynes has asked me to work with him in obtaining ROW from the residents along that narrow part. I have had no success with that effort.

I am asking for some kind of relief. Maybe you could at least start the asphalt from my driveway on to the school. Please do something to ease the dust and the speeding traffic on County Road 398.
