Re: Supplemental Environmental Project Award

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) agreed to offset a portion of the administrative penalty amount of a company to contribute to a Supplemental Environmental Project (SEP). The SEP money will be used for the collection and cleanup of abandoned tire sites. Specifically, the money will be used to coordinate with local city and county government officials and private entities to conduct tire collection events where residents will be able to drop off tires for proper disposal or recycling or to clean sites where tires have been disposed of illegally. A preference will be given to Collin County for the location of such events or cleanup followed by the Trinity River Basin and Trinity Aquifer.

The sites that TCEQ has targeted in Collin County are as follows:

CR 1006 – Approximately 50 tires

CR 400 – Approximately 100 tires (in a creek)

CR 706 – Approximately 500 tires

Representatives from TCEQ and Resource Conservation and Development, (RC&D) will be available to answer any questions related to the SEP and subsequent clean-up effort.
