Specialty Courts Coordinator Grant

Judge Self,

I sent you both the FY14 and FY15 grant applications with the pertinent drug court programs to be coordinated by the requested position highlighted. In the FY14 application, the Specialty Courts Coordinator was/is to coordinate the following 4 programs:

366th Felony DWI/Drug Court
296th Veterans Treatment Court
417th Juvenile Drug Court
CC@Law 5 Misdemeanor DWI/Drug Court

In FY15, the position has dropped the 417th Juvenile Drug Court and is to coordinate the following 3 programs:

366th Felony
296th Veterans
CC@Law 2 Misdemeanor

To my knowledge, Todd will still be performing the same functions with the Juvenile Drug Court that he already does and has done in the past, but we separated this particular program out because he does not have access to all the juvenile files in regards to grant reporting. Through the Juvenile Probation department, the 417th drug court program also receives a grant from the Office of the Governor. During grant reporting, it became very confusing and difficult to ensure that we were not double reporting program participants on both grants. Thus, it was easier to remove the juvenile reporting from this grant and ensure there was no crossover.

As for the Misdemeanor program, CCL 5 transferred their program to CCL 2. It is the same program with the same participants, but Judge Walker is now running it instead of Judge Wilson.

The only drug court program, to my knowledge, that Todd is not participating in any way is Judge Mason's CCL 1 misdemeanor program.
