Benefits to County and Citizens

The cost of drug addiction in any population is great, considering the legal and health care costs, lost wages and broken families. The 417th Juvenile Drug court program attempts to help those juveniles who are in the legal system and who display addictive behavior. The SOAR program, as it is named, provides supervision and monitoring, treatment and supportive efforts to help juveniles maintain sobriety and thereby reduce the risk of relapse and recidivism. The grant will provide funds for urinalysis and outpatient treatment.
