Pre-conference Question and Comments

Adult Facility

1. How many females are in the jail on average? Today May 19, 2015 there are 113 female and 735 male, the numbers change throughout the day.
2. What time are medication passes? See ATTACHMENT C
3. Do you have an ADA cell? Yes, one in each pod of the jail.
4. How many hours is a nurse's shift? Currently 8 hour shift and 12 hour shift
5. How many nurse per shift? Depending on the time of day 10, night shift is normally 5, a charge nurse is in addition to these numbers
6. Where are the inmates kept on suicide watch? In the infirmary and cluster 5 level 3
7. Do you take voluntary drug admissions? No
8. What does each of the color uniforms represent?
  - Red – Female Worker
  - White – Work release
  - Yellow – On restriction
  - Orange – SCORE (Sheriff's Convicted Offender Re-Entry Effort) this inmate program includes inmates who work outside the facility.
  - Green – General Housing Male
  - Blue – General Housing Female
9. What specialists currently come on site? These are seen off site
10. How many HIV are there currently? 13
11. If there is a heart condition/attack where do inmates get sent? McKinney Baylor
12. How often does X-ray come in? Once a day and when needed
13. How many bookings per day? 75 to 80
14. In the booking area, what is preferred, LVN or ENT? LVN
15. Can inmates bring in their own medication? Yes, after it is checked and sealed correctly by the outside pharmacy
16. Can IV medications be administered? Yes, we are looking good options to keep the inmates onsite rather than going to the hospital.
17. Are labs done onsite? No
18. Who is the current provider? Lab Corp/pick up daily
19. Do you work with the health department to do testing? No
20. What time are labs done? Throughout the day, consideration for when blood is drawn in very important, doing it at times when the inmate may reject, does not help to keep cost down.
21. What are the current staff vacancies? 1(6P-6A)

## Juvenile Facility

1. What is the average stay? **The average stay in short term (Pre – Adjudication) is 13 days. Long term (Post – Adjudication) is from 6, 9 to 12 months depending on what the court decides and program they enter. There are detention hearings Monday through Friday, a juvenile detained gets a hearing at least every 10 working day. There are no bonds for juveniles.**
2. Who performs the modified programs? **We have MH Counselors that work directly with our residents.**
3. Is there a booking area? **Yes – Intake area**
4. What are the ages of the juveniles? **From 10 to 17 years**
5. Are the medical records electronic? **No**
6. Is dental performed onsite for the juveniles and how is it handled? **Yes, there is a dental examining room on site.**
7. How many times a day is medications given? **3X per day, 8AM, 12PM and 8PM**
8. Can juveniles bring in their own medication? **Yes, medication is in dispensers, but is brought in sealed, counted and verified directly by the pharmacy to the nurse.**
9. Do you have a licensed counselor? **Yes – our counselors carry LPC, LCSW, LSOTP licenses.**
10. What time are medications given? **8AM, 12PM and 8PM**
11. How many does a pod hold? **12 residents**
12. Where are treatments given? **In the individual PODS**
13. How many pods are there and what is the makeup of each pod? **4 male short term pods, 4 male long term pods, one short and one long term female pods.**
14. What are the current shifts for the nursing staff? **6:00AM to 2:00PM and 2:00PM to 10:00PM**
15. What length of shifts are you looking for the nursing staff? **6AM – 10PM coverage daily.**
16. What is the preferred type of nursing staff? **LVN**

## Comments from Adult Jail

Each cluster has medical satellite room. This room has a sink.

There is room for x-ray equipment; Collin County does not have equipment onsite.

2 med passes per day

Escort free facility

Facility opened March 1994

This area LVN's are on the market

The County is open to forward thinking ideas/solutions

There is a Wello machine in the booking area to take temperatures.

The County would like to minimize transport offsite.

Cafeteria is available to provider's employees – blue plate special is \$3.00

Early ID of Mental Illness is required by statute. Notice must be made to the courts within 72 hours upon receipt of credible information that establishes reasonable cause to believe a defendant in the sheriff's custody has mental illness or mental retardation.

Once identified:

- Information shall be collected regarding whether the person has a mental illness
- Written assessment shall be provided.
