This project will add data from the North Central Texas Fusion Center to the Law Enforcement Information Exchange (LinX). Access to this system is free to local law enforcement agencies and this will expand the number of agencies that will have access to the NCTFC law enforcement data. The North Texas IBM Coplink Node has law enforcement data from approximately 1000 jurisdictions. This data is shared with major city police, county sheriffs, and state LE partners through 50 existing licenses. This project will allow an unlimited number of LE stakeholders to access this data for free through the Law Enforcement Information Exchange (LinX).
