Commissioner Thomas said over the last two weeks the Court approved bond funds for projects for the City of Plano. These were designated by the Court several years ago to be used in Plano. At this time, the Commissioner does not agree that these would be the priorities in the County and recommends changing the policy. Unless a city is specified to use the bond funds, the Court should have the discretion to use the road bond funds where it deems is the highest priority when the intended purpose for those funds is not utilized. Commissioner Williams agreed with this going forward with bond offerings but not doing it retroactively. Judge Self would also like to see a timeline included in the new policy. (Time: 1:34 p.m.)
