# **GENERAL DISCUSSION**

5. Al-45071 2018 TCDRS Presentation, Human Resources.

Cynthia Jacobson, Human Resources, came forward with a PowerPoint presentation on TCDRS (Texas County & District Retirement System). The deposit rate is 7%, matching rate is 200%, guaranteed interest rate is 7%, and the vesting period is eight years. Ms. Jacobson showed the rates of return from 2008 through 2017. There must be an 8% rate of return in order to pay the 7% guaranteed interest rate. If the rate of return is less than 8%, it is the County's responsibility to make up the differential.

There was a change in the annuity purchase rate. Benefits based on member deposits prior to January 1, 2018 will not be affected. Since people are expected to live longer, benefits based on member deposits on or after January 1, 2018 will be based on adjusted mortality tables. This change does not affect employee's retirement eligibility.

When compared to other comparable counties, Collin County's 2018 required rate is significantly less and in some cases less than half that of others. This is due to Collin County's paying down the unfunded liabilities as they have occurred rather than letting them build up and increase the rate. The cost for the past ten-year period has been approximately \$80,000 per employee.

Currently there is an unfunded liability using the five-year asset recognition method. As of December 2017, our plan has \$1,160,641 of unfunded liability which is a funded ratio of 99.8%. If the immediate asset recognition method were used instead of the five-year asset recognition method, the unfunded liability would be \$3,114,182 which is a funded ratio of 99.4%. However, financial statements must reflect the immediate asset recognition method. TCDRS exceeded their investment return goal of 8% for 2017. The actual return was 14.7%. Actuarial gains and losses are smoothed over five years and will be recognized over time.

GASB (Governmental Accounting Standards Board) Statement 68 requires Collin County to report TCDRS pension liability/assets on the CAFR (Comprehensive Annual Financial Report). GASB Statement 75 is new for fiscal years after June 15, 2017 and will have an impact on the financial statement this year. The County's OPEB (Other Post-Employment Benefits) liability is \$3,245,484 as of December 2017 and will be reported on the September 30, 2018, fiscal year-end financials. This is for the \$5,000 life insurance that TCDRS provides to retirees. This will not impact costs, but will show up on the financials as a liability.

COLAs (Cost of Living Adjustments) are funded over a 15-year period. Collin County has historically adopted various COLA options. Last year, a COLA of 40% CPI (Consumer Price Index) was approved for plan year 2018 for retirees. Ms. Jacobson did not recommend doing a COLA this year. As of the end of December 2017, there were 760 individuals collecting TCDRS benefits, 320 active employees were eligible to retire, and 344 additional employees will be eligible to retire in the next five years.

Currently, the County is paying \$315,843 for life insurance policies. This includes TCDRS 1x salary, Collin County Basic Life policy for \$50,000 and Basic AD&D (Accidental Death and Dismemberment.) Ms. Jacobson showed three options for 2019 to reduce the cost to the County. The impact of these options would include the following: 1) removing the \$5,000 TCDRS life insurance policy for retirees; 2) part-time employees would lose life insurance coverage; and 3) removing district judges, the District Attorney and CSCD (Community Supervision and Corrections Department) from the 1x their Collin County paid salary. Commissioner Williams would prefer to not continue the TCDRS insurance plan for retirees because it creates the GASB unfunded liability. Commissioners Fletcher and Webb agreed. The Court asked to see the rates for Option 1 (1x salary plus \$50,000 for a maximum of \$300,000) and Option 2 (1.5x salary plus \$50,000 for a maximum of \$400,000.) The Court asked Monika Arris, Budget, to have the \$1,160,641 of unfunded liability put into the budget. Judge Self showed the Collin County 2009 – 2019 Required Rate Computation Chart and recommended the Court monitor it. (Time: 2:01 p.m.)
