Re:	CUC TechShare and JCMS (Juvenile Case Management System) Software

This will be a discussion regarding CUC TechShare ILA for JCMS and the CUC moving TechShare to a corporation "TechShare LGC" under the local government corporation permitted by Subchapter D, Chapter 431, Texas Transportation Code and Chapter 394, Texas Local Government Code, and shall be a governmental unit within the meaning of Section 101.001 Texas Civil Practices and Remedies Code.

Commissioners Court will need to discuss the options and provide direction to either own the software or continue as a Stakeholder on the TechShare LGC. The current CUC TechShare agreement allows the County to take ownership of the source code if it has meet the following ILA requirements.

Collin has paid its entire capital share and has been using Juvenile for 5 years. Collin can take a copy of the software and run it individually. Below are the pertinent provisions from Section 16 of the current TechShare ILA:

16.4. When a Participant Withdraws from Sharing a Resource

- 16.4.1. If a Participant withdraws from sharing a Resource that is still offered through TechShare as permitted by the applicable Resource Sharing Addendum (for example, at the expiration of the Resource Sharing Addendum), the Participant will have no rights to future use of the Resource if the Participant has shared the Resource for less than 60 consecutive months.
- 16.4.2. If a Participant withdraws from sharing a Resource as permitted by the applicable Resource Sharing Addendum and has shared the Resource for at least 60 consecutive months, the Participant will be granted a non-exclusive, perpetual license for the Resource as it exists on or about the date the Participant withdraws from sharing to

use and manipulate the source materials for the Resource for the Participant's sole use.

Of course, JCMS is unique in that participants share data. If Collin (or any other user county) were to operate the system individually, that county would lose the benefit of data sharing unless some sort of integration was established between the group and the individual county. Collin IT can also look at integration options.

If the direction is for Collin IT to own a copy of the code then we will need to explore the options on how to support the product for Juvenile Probation. This could include additional development staff and/or contract development services. Otherwise the Commissioners Court will need to appoint a Commissioner to reside on the TechShare LGC Stakeholders Board.
