Judge Self read the public notice on the tax increase as required by the state legislature, "Last year the Collin County Property tax rate was \$0.245--that rate raised \$150,671,364--a portion of which was used to fund operations such as: public safety, to include jail operations and patrol activities within unincorporated and incorporated areas of the county as requested by local law enforcement, as well as Homeland Security funding to provide county and regional homeland security planning efforts; judicial, to include all county-wide criminal, civil, and misdemeanor court systems, in addition to all support functions for these operations; legal, to include all aspects of review and prosecution of cases considered within the county; general, to include policy formulation and implementation, technical support for all county and regional operations, and election support for local and county-wide elections; public works, to include all county road maintenance activities and the implementation of the county's 10-year asphalt program, in addition to environmental clean-up and bulky household trash disposal; permanent improvements, to include the cash funding of county wide facilities improvement activities such as an energy management upgrade of all county facilities and the new animal control facility to be jointly funded through a regional partnership with area municipalities. This year Collin County is proposing a property tax rate of \$0.245; that rate would raise \$168,278,612 which is \$17,607,248 more than the taxes imposed last year. By contrast, for a \$100,000 home, this additional tax revenue will decrease taxes by \$3.07. Two public hearings have been scheduled to consider the decrease. The first public hearing is being held today, the second is on September 4, 2007, at 7:00 p.m. in the Central Jury Room at the Collin County Courthouse, 2100 Bloomdale Road, McKinney, You have a right to attend the hearings and make comments; you are encouraged to attend and make comments, if you wish."

Rodney Rhoades, Budget, gave a brief presentation stating that the tax base did increase by 10.9%, representing an appraised value for Collin County of \$68.7 billion. 5.5% is attributed to existing value, 5.4% is attributed to new construction, and the average home value in Collin County is \$230,813. The tax rate is still proposed at \$.245 for 2008. The total combined budget represents a 4.8% increase to \$262.6 million. Total operating budget (general fund, road & bridge fund, permanent improvement fund, and jury fund) is \$174.3 million which

represents a 3.4% increase over the prior year. The general fund budget is proposed at \$154.3 million and that is a 4.7% increase over 2007. All of these proposed numbers include the proposed changes from the budget workshop. After the two public hearings, today and September 4, 2007, the final vote will be taken on September 11, 2007. (Time: 9:13:39 a.m.)

Judge Self opened the public hearing. Mr. Baumbauch did not want to speak.

Officer Kevin Hugghins, Highway Patrol, stood before the Court and made a case for keeping the full-time county paid highway patrol secretary. Judge Raleeh stepped forward to give his thought on incorporating this position into his staff. (Time: 9:19:58 a.m.) Rodney Rhoades led the court back to the issue of the deleted position, asking for direction from the Court. Commissioner Hatchell motioned to put one full-time position back at the DPS, Commissioner Cole seconded, and the motion passed with a 4-1 vote of the Court. Commissioner Hoagland dissented. (Time: 10:12:30 a.m.)

Discussion continued on additional position(s) in the future for a clerk to do arraignments, indigent defense, and collections, relieving the JPs' offices of this duty. Judge Raleeh supported this idea saying it would be great to have the consistency of one person doing these jobs and everyone would know who to contact at any given time. Commissioner Cole made a motion to add this position, Commissioner Hatchell seconded, and the motion passed with a 5-0 vote of the Court. (Time: 10:16:08 a.m.)

Tim Overbey came before the Court to express his opinion concerning various articles recently published and what he felt were discrepancies between the story and the reality of county pay. Mr. Overbey stated he thought Human Resources must be the responsible party. This generated conversation between Court members and Sheriff Terry Box about getting his staff on pay-for-performance. (Time: 9:39:25 a.m.)

Mr. Rhoades continued, asking for clarification concerning the District Attorney's office and the request and agreement on the two part-time felony prosecutors and two full-time felony prosecutors. Mr. Rhoades stated that currently the budget reflects two full-time felony prosecutors in the special crimes division. Judge Self stated that the part-time positions were not approved in the Budget Workshop. Commissioner Cole motioned to remove from the recommended budget the two full-time white collar crime prosecutors, Commissioner Hatchell seconded, and the motion passed with a 4-1 vote of the Court. Commissioner Hoagland dissented. (Time: 10:19:43 a.m.)

Mr. Rhoades stated that the Board of District Judges met recently. They did not approve an increase for the court reporters for 2008 for the district courts. The Court's decision for the rank and file employee was 4% for non-exempt employees; County Court at Law court reporters are currently considered non-exempt and therefore according to the direction of the Court will be eligible for 4%. Mr.

Rhoades asked for clarification on whether the 4% is being given to them. District Court judges have the discretion on their court reporters but the County Court at Law courts are at the discretion of the Commissioners Court. Commissioner Cole motioned to keep all court reporters at their current salaries, Commissioner Jaynes seconded, and the motion passed with a 5-0 vote of the Court. (Time: 10:22:32 a.m.)

Sheriff Box came forward asking for clarification on the six movement officers for the pod that is opening soon, noting that these employees would also work the second pod when it opens. Sheriff Box also asked for reconsideration on the budget analyst and payroll clerk positions he was requesting, saying he would combine the positions for one new employee. Sheriff Box also gave information about the Health & Safety Deputy that was to be transferred from his office. Commissioner Jaynes motioned to approve the six movement officers, Commissioner Hatchell seconded, and the motion passed with a 4-1 vote of the Court. Commissioner Hoagland dissented. Concerning the other positions Sheriff Box was requesting, Judge Self asked for an organizational chart of the Sheriff's department before making any decisions. (Time: 10:26:29 a.m.)

(Time: 10:12:23 a.m.) Commissioner Jaynes brought up the tax rate versus the rise in home value and the subsequent costs to the tax payers. Discussion followed on the possibility of an exemption or a deeper cut in the tax rate, pros and cons. (Time: 9:51:56 a.m.)
