GENERAL DISCUSSION

Public Hearing adopting the Collin County Mobility Plan, AI-27596 Engineering. Ruben Delgado, Engineering, stated he was back before the Court with a presentation addressing questions and comments presented at the June 2007 Court, with the goal of leading to the adoption of the Collin County Mobility Plan. Mike McAnelly, Project Manager, Jacobs Carter Burgess, came before the Court with a Power Point presentation entitled "Collin County Mobility Plan 2007 Update". Mr. McAnelly continued with the Power Point presentation outlining the following topics: Plan Development Methodology; Study Area - Collin County, Texas; Adopted CCMP 2002 Update; Purpose of Mobility Plan; Changes Since 2002 Update; Collin County Population and Employment Growth Forecasts; Future Land Use; continued Future Land Use; Environmental Constraints; Population Forecast; continued Population Forecast; Employment Forecast; continued Employment Forecast; Transportation Serial Zones; Projected Future Traffic Year 2030 PM Peak Hour; Travel Demand Forecasts; Level of Service; Projected Level of Service (LOS) for 2015 PM Peak Hour; Projected Level of Service (LOS) for 2030 PM Peak Hour; 2015 Network Improvements; Recommended Thoroughfare Plan Collin County Mobility Plan 2007 Update; Typical Sections Collin County Mobility Plan 2007 Update.

Commissioner Hoagland asked if the area colored gray on the map represented a sparsely populated area. Mr. McAnelly replied gray represented sparsely populated rural development, yellow represented residential, brighter colors represented commercial, manufacturing or office employment, and green represented open space. Mr. McAnelly continued with the Power Point presentation, explaining the level of service designations for roadways. Commissioner Hatchell motioned to adopt the Collin County Mobility Plan, Commissioner Hoagland seconded, and the motion passed with a 4-0 vote of the Court. (Time: 2:05:53 p.m.)

Consideration, discussion and any action regarding Sexually 6. AI-27684 Oriented Businesses, Commissioners Court. Bill Bilyeu, Administrative Services, stated the Court had been presented with a copy of a proposed sexually oriented business court order to start the public hearing process with a workshop scheduled for February or March. Jim Shepherd explained that he looked at the existing sexually oriented business order in order to legally further restrict the possibility of the existence of sexually oriented businesses in Collin County. Mr. Shepherd said the question is how do you regulate the businesses lawfully, how do you license the businesses properly, and how do you revoke a license when a business crosses the line. Commissioner Hatchell asked what the legal distances are between churches and sexually oriented businesses and if the current distances can be increased. Mr. Shepherd replied there are a few different ways to address that concern: how far is far enough, or do you group all of the like businesses together. Discussion followed between Mr. Shepherd and the Court on topics of alcohol sales, location of businesses from schools, parks and churches, proximity

to highways and hours of operation. Commissioner Hatchell motioned to move ahead with enactment of this item, Commissioner Hoagland seconded, and the motion passed with a 4-0 vote of the Court. (Time: 2:23:23 p.m.)

HELD

Update, discussion and any action regarding the outer loop right 8. AI-27784 of way acquisition, Engineering. Ruben Delgado, Engineering, stated he was before the Court as requested with an update on the progress of the Outer Loop in the last year. Mr. Delgado explained the Outer Loop is fifty-five (55) miles long, extending from the Denton County line, going eastward towards Blue Ridge, turning south towards Farmersville, and then south towards Rockwall County. Mr. Delgado continued, adding there are three important segments in the Outer Loop, and he would be discussing the sections showing the growth in Collin County, which is where the Outer Loop is coincident with mainly the Dallas North Toll road and Preston Road, between US 75 and Highway 121. Commissioner Hoagland expressed concern about the corridor from Rockwall County. Mr. Delgado replied that section was included. At this point Mr. Delgado referred to the Recommended Thoroughfare Plan, Collin County Mobility Plan 2007 Update Map, and the Outer Loop ROW Acquisition handout, which listed thirty (30) parcels affected between US 75 and Highway 121.

Jeff Durham, Parks and Projects Manager, explained the Outer Loop ROW Acquisition handout, stating they have all the appraisals and surveying documents needed to proceed with the right-of-way acquisition and have acquired the services of Maptech, an acquisition firm, which is working on securing the right-of-way in that area. Mr. Durham continued with an explanation of the handout. Explanation and discussion continued between Mr. Durham, Rusty Ozmer, HNTB, and the Court, with Commissioner Hoagland asking if the surveyors will need to enter parcel no. 30's property. Mr. Ozmer replied they may need to, and Mr. Durham agreed. Commissioner Hatchell asked about the acreage listed on the handout, and Mr. Durham replied that that 174 acres was the total amount of acreage for the first eighteen (18) parcels. Mr. Durham also stated there were some homes that would be affected and would be acquired, and that there is a damage amount to the remainder of the property. Commissioner Hoagland noted the property owners with "no reply" and "right of entry denied" on the "Comments" section of the handout should be taken to Court. Mr. Delgado stated they were asking the Court's approval to do that. Mr. Durham stated the reason access to the properties is necessary is to be able to create the actual take area, have a legal survey, set monumentation, to come up with an acreage for the appraiser to value.

Commissioner Cole stated it would helpful for the Court to be able to look at the map and see how much land a property owner has and Commissioner Hoagland

requested another column be added to the handout listing total acreage. Mr. Delgado stated they needed the Court's approval to proceed with legal requirements to gain right of entry onto those properties listed on the handout. Commissioner Hoagland motioned to approve, Commissioner Hatchell seconded, and the motion passed with a 4-0 vote of the Court. (Time: 2:37:00 p.m.)

Mr. Delgado stated Mr. Ozmer would give a brief report on the engineering. Mr. Ozmer stated HNTB was asked by the County to develop a two-lane roadway schematic from US 75 to Highway 121, and that has been completed and the right-of-way has been verified. Discussion followed between Mr. Ozmer, Mr. Delgado and the Court. (Time: 2:39:58 p.m.)
