GENERAL DISCUSSION

ITEM NO. 5 Al-29606 Presentation, discussion and any action regarding an agreement with the Texas Council of Urban Counties (CUC) and Tyler Technologies for the addition of the Odyssey Law Enforcement, Jail

Manager, and Constable Software (NTE 2,796,222), budget amendment in the amount of \$2,598,448 and further authorize the County Judge to finalize and execute the Participation Agreement and Maintenance Agreement that incorporates the Jail Management and Law Enforcement Module, Information Technology.

Caren Skipworth, IT Director, gave a PowerPoint presentation on the next phase of the CIJS project and to update the newly appointed commissioners on the current project. Ms. Skipworth stated that it is recommended that the funds be procured out of the 2003 existing short term debts; therefore, the funds already exist and will not cost the County any additional money. Ms. Skipworth continued, saying the next phase will cover implementation of the Odyssey system for Law Enforcement and Jail Management. The presentation included the costs to the County, the schedule for implementation and the project team members. Discussion with the Court. Ms. Skipworth stated this project would be included in PFP expectations and only results based compensation allowed would be provided to actual CIJS Project team members. Overtime may be necessary because temporary employees could not be utilized in the Jail. There would have to be staff available to back up the project team members if needed. Questions followed regarding this compensation from the Court as to what it entailed. Discussion between Ms. Skipworth and the Court.

Charles Gray, Manager of the Tech Share Project, Conference of Urban Counties, approached to give the Court an overview of the program and participating counties. At least seven counties are ready to join Collin in shared resources for this project. Mr. Gray gave comments on the cost savings to the county by participating in the CUC. Mr. Gray also explained that the county would be completely covered in this project if the county participated in the multi-county agreement. This would authorize Tyler to implement the software while the association acted as administrator over the project. Commissioner Shaheen had questions as to the county's ability to stop the project if need be and how the county would be invoiced. Further explanation was given by Mr. Gray. Discussion with Mr. Gray and the Court followed. Motion to approve participation agreement with the Texas Council of Urban Counties and Tyler Technologies for the addition of the next phase of the CIJS project.

Greg Church, AgriLife Extension Service, approached the Court to request approval to use Myers Park for research and demonstration projects with plants that would require no pesticides and limited water needs for conservation of natural resources. The primary funding would come from the Collin County Master Gardeners Association, which is a non-profit organization. Additional funding would come from various other non-profits. Discussion with the court. Linda Dixon, Meyers Park Manager, approached to say they are very happy to have this project at the park and it would not interfere with any events. Mr. Church also gave an overview on a project to catch and reuse rain water. Judge Self asked about the maintenance of this project once it was finished. Ruben Delgado, Engineering, approached to say there was no ILA so the county would maintain the landscape.

ITEM NO. 7 Al-29588 Consideration, discussion and any action regarding the installation of the Inthinc Vehicle Tracking Device on two Collin County fleet vehicles to monitor safe driving practices, Public Works. Kleinheksel, Public Works, approached to request approval of the installation of Inthine Vehicle Tracking Devices for testing purposes. There is no cost for the installation and the devices would provide information such as vehicle is idling too long, driver is being too aggressive, equipment strays off designated path, etc... Mr. Kleinheksel said this technology would provide information for developing cost savings, not just monitoring liability. Judge Self asked if a cost benefit analysis had been performed. Mr. Kleinheksel responded saying not yet, the reason for the two devices as a test is to see if this technology is a viable option. Commissioner Jaynes expressed his concern about the effect this could have on the employees who may think this is another tool for "big brother". There is a fee of \$20 per month per unit. Just trying to obtain information on what is available. Discussion by the Court. At the end of two months he would have data to bring back to the Court. Motion to approve the installation of two devices for two months.

Monika Arris, Budget and Finance. approached with recommendations for the FY2010 Budget Calendar. Handouts were given to Court members. Kick off will be March 5 and 6: May 1, packets due back from departments: June 15-19. Budget Department reviews this item and it could be posted as a public meeting to allow Court members to attend. Discussion followed with the Court concerning timelines and processes. Judge Self recommended approval of adding discussions to monthly workshops. Commissioner Hoagland stated he wants the Court to go to individual departments and observe what they do daily. Discussion by members followed to figure how to allow the Court to visit each office without overwhelming the staff. Bill Bilveu. Administrative Services, approached to say if all the Court members, plus additional staff, visited each office, it would overwhelm them due to the size of the visiting party. Additional discussion followed. Judge Self directed Mr. Bilyeu to start a process that would allow the Court to schedule meetings onsite to observe various departments as they conduct daily business. Commissioner Hoagland suggested beginning FY2011 budget year in October as soon as the FY 2010 was effective. Commissioner Ward said there should be a penalty for the departments who have not submitted their operating statistics to the Budget Department. This could be a 10% decrease in overall budget dollars approved. Commissioner Jaynes suggested making the budget documents a standing agenda item. These documents are now being posted to the share point for review by the court.

ITEM NO. 10 Al-29652 Consideration, discussion and any action regarding NACo's posting of a Public Affairs Special Projects Coordinator position, Commissioners Court. Judge Self introduced this item by saying he requested this addition because of the job description that NACo posted to the web for the position of Public Affairs Special Projects Coordinator. Robert Chambers, Frisco, Texas, approached to discuss the job posting and job duties of the posted position of Public Affairs Special Projects

Coordinator for the National Association of Counties (NACo). Mr. Chambers expressed his concern about the attitude of the Commissioners' Court toward allowing taxpayers a voice in the County. Mr. Chambers continued with examples of what he called the government voting benefits for themselves that the average taxpayer does not get, such as Longevity Pay and Lap band Surgery. Commissioner Hoagland asked Mr. Chambers if he represented himself or an organization, and how did he hear about this? Mr. Chambers responded saying he did belong to an organization; however, he represented only himself. Commissioner Jaynes gave comments regarding the improper wording in the posting. Commissioner Shaheen commented that the Court drafted a letter stating their displeasure with the job posting and its description. Discussion continued as to whether Collin County should remain in NACo since it in great part goes against the interests of the taxpayers in Collin County. Judge Self questioned the 2006 expense of 158,000 taxpayer dollars for various membership dues for seven pages' worth of organizations. These memberships fall under the purview of elected officials, but ultimately the taxpayers are the payers of these dues. Judge Self continued by saying the Court needs to revisit the need for membership to all of the different organizations NACo represents. Additional discussion followed. Motion to approve letter as amended.

Mr. Scott stated there were issues with the project; however, it was moving forward. He continued by saying in his opinion this was a step in the right direction. Further discussion. Commissioner Hoagland agreed this was a step in the right direction. Further discussion. Commissioner Hoagland suggested this should be approved pending an agreement with the cities of Celina, Nevada and Collin County. Commissioner Hoagland also said he agreed with this and believed the Court should approve it; however, he expressed concern over the lack of a development agreement. Judge Self stated he did not think the Court should just verbally approve this without a contingency. Commissioner Hoagland added, revise legislation to reflect, cannot move forward without an agreement. Commissioner Jaynes stated Collin County needs to set policy for this and future similar items.
