GENERAL DISCUSSION

5. <u>Al-31686</u> Collin County Adventure Camp update, YMCA.

Ann McWilliams from Collin County Adventure Camp and Kevin Spaeth from the YMCA returned to present the Court with firmer estimates and additional information and answers to specific questions as requested by the Commissioners at a previous court. She had a report with summaries of estimated costs for monies remaining. She stated she had met with the original Advisory Board and 6 out of 9 members were disappointed that some of the money wasn't being used to buy adjoining pieces of land, although efforts had been made.

Ms. McWilliams said the Advisory Board is 100% in support of the items being presented. They support everything the YMCA wants and needs at this time. She added, the Advisory Board felt this was a good opportunity to move into a new facility.

Bed replacement was the first topic discussed. Ms. McWilliams said they have a firmer and lower estimate than previously presented to the Court. Ninety percent of the comment cards from guests at the camp were negative comments about the beds. Mr. Spaeth said 20-30% of evaluations specifically mention beds. Ms. McWilliams related a story a YMCA staff member shared with her. A few years ago they hosted an American Camping Association Conference that was very successful. A couple years later when Collin County Adventure Camp was

brought up, someone said, "That's that new camp that has the uncomfortable beds." Ms. McWilliams stated that is not the kind of word of mouth that will be conducive to attracting conferences to the camp in the future.

Mr. Spaeth said they communicated with Bill Bilyeu, Administrative Services, and they can resell the bed frames. It is against federal law to resell the mattresses. Commissioner Ward asked how much they would get for the bed frames. Neither Mr. Spaeth nor Mr. Bilyeu knew for sure, but Mr. Bilyeu said it wouldn't be substantial, probably less than \$10,000. Commissioner Shaheen asked how many people come through the camp annually. Mr. Spaeth replied 23,000 people come through the camp annually and that number is growing.

Ms. McWilliams next addressed the issue of separate wireless internet for camp use, stating the current estimate of \$7,200 is way down from the original ballpark estimate of \$50,000. She thanked Commissioner Shaheen for working with them on that. Ms. McWilliams said there are more and more requests and requirements from groups using the camp, such as school groups, for dependable wireless to be able to do everything that is required and separate wireless is the only dependable way to do that. The state is now requiring teachers to teach outdoors so there will be more uses for this outdoor classroom which will be coupled with the need to use computers. Ms. McWilliams said there will be an additional cost of \$400 per month to maintain the separate wireless internet and that will be rolled into the YMCA's operation. Commissioner Javnes asked if any schools have not come to the camp because of the lack of wireless internet. Mr. Spaeth said no. Judge Self asked why they need to use the computer outdoors. Ms. McWilliams said the computer is a tool and the schools want to utilize it outdoors. Commissioner Shaheen noted it is not internet access to the entire 400 acre camp as previously requested but rather the education building, dining hall, courtyard area, and part of the outside area. Judge Self asked if they spoke to the school districts about partnering on the wireless costs. Mr. Spaeth said no because the cost went down from \$50,000 to \$7,200. Judge Self asked if the \$7,200 included a firewall against pornography and other things. Ms. McWilliams said it included the YMCA technical support and security firewalls. Commissioner Shaheen said the YMCA's filtering process would block access to those sites.

The next topic was the central energy management system, which Ms. McWilliams said was unchanged from last time. Mr. Spaeth requested information from Trane regarding the return on investment on this piece but hadn't heard from them so he has no information. He thought it was very important to share that information with the Court. Judge Self asked why we would do this unless there is additional savings. Mr. Spaeth agreed and he felt there would be more savings, but he wanted to make sure of that before the project moves forward.

Ms. McWilliams spoke of acoustical panels next. She thought the rest of the items requested could come under this umbrella, the need for extra spaces, for utilizing the spaces they have already and utilizing them better. They have a problem with too much light causing presentations not to work well. When schools come, they are bringing all of their schools. They are often at max capacity of 300 plus students. They need 12 spaces for groups that large. They can use the dining hall and education building, but on stormy days they have sectioned off space in the education building or in the dining hall at the same time. When you have all of the echoing going on, it makes it difficult to maintain attention especially with young people, but even with adults. Ms. McWilliams continued, the camp was built with the Collin County population in mind for 2026. They want to make the spaces as usable as possible. The two pavilion spaces that were meant for rainy days and days when it wasn't windy can't be utilized because of drainage. There is a need for an additional classroom in the education building and they haven't gotten to maximum capacity. The remaining things would enable them to add spaces and utilize them better by having less echo and less light when it is fully utilized.

Ms. McWilliams concluded by saying the original Advisory Board had interest in the purchase of land. Any money left in the account, and there is a good possibility there will be money left, she recommended be used for eventual land purchase as it's a safety buffer area. Commissioner Shaheen asked if there should be an improvement fund for this as well or can the permanent improvement fund be applied to something like this? Mr. Bilyeu said that is the responsibility of the YMCA. Once the contract is up, the facility has to be up to the same standards it was the day the County handed it over to them.

Joe Ann Stahel came forward to speak. She thanked the Commissioners Court, Ann McWilliams, Kevin Spaeth and the YMCA for working together. It's been a great cooperative effort. She would like to see it continue. She'd like to see more regular meetings with people from the YMCA and the Commissioners or the County to prevent a situation like this from happening again. Ms. Stahel also stated Collin County has Sister Grove and Park Hill Prairie which could also be utilized by the YMCA. These offer unique opportunities.

Judge Self wanted to vote individually on the items requested.

a. <u>AI-31817</u> Bed Replacement. Commissioner Shaheen stated the beds aren't optimal but they're comfortable enough; therefore, he will not support bed replacement. Commissioner Ward said part of the revenue coming in to the camp

is from adults through businesses. She added, the beds are probably worse than the prison beds. Commissioner Hoagland made a motion to approve.

Mr. Spaeth added the amphitheater is also used as an additional daytime classroom, so it is a multi-use area. Commissioner Jaynes made a motion to approve.

Following the vote, Commissioner Ward recognized and thanked members of the Adventure Camp present in Court. Judge Self stated there were several hundred thousand dollars left and he asked Mr. Bilyeu to take a look at that and see what is the best thing to do. Additional land is one option but Judge Self wanted to know how to use it correctly.

6. Al-31738 Bond Capacity update, County Judge.

Judge Self stated for the audience we are discussing fund balances in anticipation of Item Number 7 which is either awarding or not awarding a contract for the Courthouse extension.

Monika Arris, Budget, came forward with a Power Point presentation entitled "Debt Impact on FY2011 Budget" and presented the Court with an update and

overview continuation from the April 19, 2010, Court. The first slide she showed was the tax rate from 1990 to the present. Ms. Arris stated the Central Appraisal District (CAD) gave her several different scenarios based on the tax base, ranging from best to moderate to worst case. She factored the moderate case and worst case scenarios into her presentation. She left out the best case scenario. The moderate case scenario will increase debt service to \$0.06193 from \$0.05542 and will decrease tax revenue to operating funds by \$10.7 million for FY2011 and reduce the general fund balance down to 186 days by FY2015 based on very conservative growth patterns in the five-year plan.

Commissioner Shaheen asked for assumptions for growth in the budget for that five-year period. Ms. Arris said based on information she has received from CAD it shows the County dropping about 4.7% for 2010, still dropping approximately another 2% for 2011, balancing out to no growth for 2012 and then a 1% growth thereafter. Commissioner Shaheen asked for assumptions on the expenditure side. Ms. Arris said on the expenditure side she shows a 4% decrease in our budget for 2011 overall followed by a very moderate growth from there, roughly 2-3% for the next five years based on the cost of fuel, electricity, indigent defense, things like that.

Ms. Arris continued with her presentation, saying if the Court wished to maintain the current debt service tax rate of \$0.05542, they would need to allocate \$10.8 million over a three-year period under the moderate case scenario of the general fund balance. We would still end up with 185 days in the general fund balance by FY2015 and it would decrease tax revenue to operating funds by \$6.4 million for FY2011. If the Court chooses to stay at a debt rate of \$0.05542, they would not have the capacity to sell debt until 2013. Judge Self stated they would have to take into account the impact of money coming out of the M & O (Maintenance and Operation) rate because when the bond was passed, citizens were promised the overall tax rate would not go up. Ms. Arris agreed.

Ms. Arris moved on to the worst case scenario. She stated the worst case scenario would increase the debt service tax rate to \$0.06357, decrease tax revenue to operating funds by \$15.1 million for FY2011 and based on scenarios given for worst case growth would leave us with 89 days of fund balance by FY2015. Ms. Arris said her assumptions were we are dropping approximately 7% for FY2010, dropping another 4% in 2011 and another 2% in 2012, and not balancing out to even until 2013 and then a slow 1% growth after that. Ms. Arris stated her estimates are very conservative. Judge Self said this is a steady state; these are our current commitments for debt. He continued, so worst case scenario, our current commitments reduce our general fund balance down below what we will need to maintain our triple A bond rating. Ms. Arris said yes, that was correct.

Commissioner Jaynes said the general fund balance is \$132 million and he wanted to know what would happen if you take out 120 days. Ms. Arris said 120

days would be \$50 million but she is projecting out over a five-year period as of today's adopted budget. Commissioner Shaheen said it is about \$400,000 per day; \$132 million represents 32 days. Ms. Arris said it is \$418,000 per day. Ms. Arris answered further questions from Court members. Commissioner Jaynes stated he did not want anything to hurt the triple A bond rating.

Ms. Arris continued with the worst case scenario, saying in order to maintain current debt service tax rate of \$0.05542, we would need to use \$19.6 million over a five-year period of fund balance, that would decrease tax revenue to operating funds by \$9.7 million and reduce general fund days of fund balance to 88 days by FY2015.

Judge Self said Ms. Arris's assumption is, it is going to grow, and that's what we've been saying all along, it's in the Efficiency Committee, it's in performance objectives for employees, defined budget cuts. Ms. Arris stated she has a cut for FY2011 but after that she is assuming growth. Commissioner Jaynes said the \$19.6 million over the next five years with the worst case scenario is something we have to do to keep up with our current commitments. Judge Self said this is current commitments and steady state. Ms. Arris said yes. Ms. Arris said you can go up higher on the debt service tax rate and have less revenue on the M & O side or you can apply the money straightforward. Commissioner Shaheen said there are endless options. We need to look in detail at what our budget is over a five-year period and maybe there is some shifting over to the operational piece, maybe there is some buying down. The budget will be very tough this year. Commissioner Jaynes said voters were promised we wouldn't raise taxes.

Ms. Arris said the discussion before the Court on the next agenda item is the courthouse addition. She said there is a \$28 million fund balance in the permanent improvement fund and that is for buildings. Her recommendation is to use \$12 million out of there to continue the courthouse expansion. The other half has been sold in bonds. Ms. Arris stated she has gone through the accounts and there is enough money in contingency from previously sold bonds for the \$5.8 million requested for roads this year.

Commissioner Shaheen asked for clarification of the bond money and projects partnering with cities. Discussion followed. Commissioner Shaheen said Tracy Homfeld, Engineering, has worked with all the engineering departments in the different cities. \$5.8 million represents projects the cities are ready to move on. Judge Self said approximately \$1 million of the \$5.8 million is for county road projects.

Judge Self asked Jon Kleinheksel, Public Works, if drainage projects for 2010 are all necessary. Mr. Bilyeu answered that question, saying they are bridge replacements. Right-of-way has been acquired and engineering is ready to go.

Commissioner Hoagland made a motion to approve the recommendation to fund \$11.8 million for courthouse expansion from the permanent improvement fund. (Time: 10:26 a.m.)

He said the way TCDRS interprets the law, they cannot do two tiers today, so the Commissioners would have to lobby to have that changed. Commissioner Jaynes said for those listening, his impression is existing employees will remain the same but there would be a change to the match rate for new employees, much like longevity pay. Commissioner Shaheen said this needed to be addressed today so that a Commissioners Court 30 or 40 years from now is not faced with a huge liability. (Time: 10:30 a.m.)
