Mr. Burke responded saying when the plumbers started installing the plumbing and the walls were being framed, it was discovered the access was not as it should be; therefore the walls were moved before the framing was completed. Additionally, the HVAC units were in the bar joists so, in order to change filters and such they had to be moved down. When they looked at moving them down, they blocked some of the windows in the gymnasium, so it was decided to move the units to the opposite side of the gymnasium away from the windows. 8. RTC monthly update, Commissioner, Precinct 3.

Commissioner Joe Jaynes updated the court on the RTC (Regional Transportation Council). The most important topic in the last meeting was the legislative agenda for the RTC.

Regarding transportation, there are four points the council wants to present to the legislature. The first is to stop diversions, the second to increase gas tax, the third to index the gas tax and the fourth was local option which was tied to another agenda item; the county's 2035 plan. Commissioners Jaynes saw this as telling the counties if they voted against the council's legislative item, they would in turn remove "lines off the map" for the 2035 plan. The legislative agenda was passed by a vote of 23-9. Collin County was contingent, many representatives from other counties and cities agreed with stopping the diversions, but had an issue with the other three.

Judge Self commented on an article he found in the Fort Worth Star Telegram which indicated the RTC would allocate local funds to pay for foreign workers. The cost of \$85,000 would cover applications, legal fees and other expenses. Judge Self asked that this be placed on a future agenda when Commissioner Jaynes gets more information on the issue.
