Commissioner Webb was present as part of the quorum when the meeting convened at 9:30 a.m. Commissioner Webb was subpoenaed for Jury Duty and unable to attend the remainder of the meeting when it was re-convened at 10:30 a.m.

Commissioner Shaheen led the Invocation.

Commissioner Williams led the Pledge of Allegiance.

1. Judge Self called to order the meeting of the Collin County Commissioners' Court at 9:31 a.m. Due to inclement weather and a delayed opening for County offices; Judge Self recessed the meeting until 10:30 a.m.

Judge Self reconvened the meeting of the <u>Collin County Commissioners' Court</u> at 10:31 a.m. and after public comments recessed into the meeting of the <u>Collin County Health Care Foundation.</u>

President Self called to order the meeting of the Collin County Health Care Foundation at 10:39 a.m. and adjourned the meeting at 10:39 a.m.

President Self called to order the meeting of the Collin County Toll Road Authority at 10:39 a.m. and adjourned the meeting at 10:40 a.m.

- 2. Public Comments. Bill Baumbach, Wylie, came forward to give comments on the vote centers which were used during the General Election on November 2, 2010. He presented three pictures of one of the centers to the court. The voters liked the centers and Mr. Baumbach thinks they can work; however, there are issues that need to be addressed. Mr. Baumbach gave information on vote centers used successfully in other counties. One reason for success in the counties where the vote centers work is adequate parking. Utilizing libraries and schools for voting limits parking for voters as well as having room for the voters in the buildings. Another issue is communications. Because there was only one card, the laptops were a failure; in the successful counties they use several poll books which allow multiple lines, processing the voters faster. Mr. Baumbach suggested utilizing the larger churches which have plenty of parking and are typically closed on Tuesdays. Mr. Baumbach watched many people drive around looking for a place to park and then leave. The vote centers can be used until there is an election year; when there is an election year there will be a crisis. The system Discussion with the court regarding parking should be re-thought in a different way. and transportation for voters and good communications followed. (Time: 10:30 a.m.)

The item was held for a future court agenda; however, one blue card was submitted regarding the subject of the vote centers. Judge Self welcomed the speaker.

Chris Freeman, McKinney, came forward to give comments on the vote centers. Mr. Freeman is the GOP Precinct Chair, Precinct 102 and has served as an Election Judge for the past several years. He strongly supports the idea of the vote centers, which proved more opportunity for people to vote; however, during the General Election there were issues that the court needs to address. The primary issue at the Valley Creek vote center was a shortage of equipment. They processed 1,200 voters and had only six (6) machines and had only one laptop. Early in the Election Day there was an issue with the software used to process the voters. A lot of the processing had to be done manually. In addition, during this election the county assigned a county employee to each vote center. The purpose was to assist with any technology related issues that may occur. In Mr. Freeman's opinion the employees were more of a hindrance than a help; they were not able to address the software issue so they (Election Judges) were forced to call the county continuously until it was resolved. When the employee tried to help process voters, it actually slowed down the process significantly. It is an expense the county does not need to incur. As a taxpayer, Mr. Freeman thinks it was a waste of money, it was a good idea, but the employee did not have the level of comfort with the computer system.

Judge Self gave comments saying this was the first time he had heard that the employees were not a help. There are numerous comments regarding the vote centers included with the agenda packet. Most agreed with Mr. Freeman that it is a good concept, it just needs some work. Judge Self encouraged everyone to look at the comments. Commissioner Shaheen asked where the bottle neck actually occurred. Mr. Freeman responded in the shortage of voting machines as well as the laptops and voter software. They had to take the system off-line, process several voters, and then went back on-line to update the system.

Once updated, they had to take it off-line again in order to process the voters efficiently. If they stayed online while processing it took a minute or more to process each voter. Brief discussion with the court followed. (Time: 10:51 a.m.)
