Sol Gieser, Kirby-Smith Machinery, said he understands the County has been looking into buying new road construction equipment. He stated over the last few years they have been asked to do training and product demonstrations which cost a considerable amount of money. He said they were told numerous times they were the leader between two companies for the bidding process for the new equipment. As of July 1st, he states they did not hear anything from the County and were not allowed to speak to anyone. He noticed this item on the court agenda and said he believes they are quoting \$100,000 less in package price. He said they invested a lot of time and materials for this bid and he is curious as to why they were not informed or had any contact in the last few weeks.

Jon Kleinheksel, Public Works, said they were approached by Kirby-Smith and were asked if they would be willing to test their products. He said two weeks ago he instructed his staff to no longer contact the salesmen and they would work through purchasing. He said the total package price does not come out to \$100,000 more as Mr. Gieser stated but is actually \$6,000 more. Commissioner Shaheen said it appears the delta is \$3,000. Commissioner Shaheen asked if there are functional differences and Mr. Kleinheksel said yes. Frank Ybarbo, Purchasing, said they performed the proper processes regarding quotes and bids. Commissioner Shaheen made a motion to approve. (Time: 1:42 p.m.)

GENERAL DISCUSSION

5. AI-33738 Compensation analysis and benefits, Human Resources.

Cynthia Jacobson, Human Resources, presented a 2011 Salary Structure Analysis. She said there are 716 employees in 107 non-exempt positions with an average length of service of over eight years. 133 of the employees are at the maximum of the pay range. As part of the analysis they reviewed the pay ranges of the positions and identified any positions whose minimum and maximum were 10% higher or lower than the average minimum and maximum.

Ms. Jacobson presented the turnover rates and percentages for each individual department from FY2010.

She discussed the responses to adequate compensation question presented in an exit interview. Commissioner Webb asked why Health Care had so many people strongly disagree that they were provided an adequate rate of pay for their job. Ms. Jacobson said the nurses feel their compensation is not comparable to those of hospitals.

Ms. Jacobson discussed the data collected concerning previous pay versus Collin County hire pay and the pay cuts people took to work for the County. She presented each individual department with their percentages.

Judge Self asked if she has had an opportunity to see why the Bureau of Labor and Statistics (BLS) reported the wages in Collin County have decreased by 1.8%. Ms. Jacobson said they haven't had a chance to look at this but when you have people coming into the County who were previously unemployed it drops the rates. Commissioner Shaheen said it looks as though the County has been doing well concerning pay increases as opposed to the other entities.

Ms. Jacobson discussed the average pay for performance lump sum increases. She presented the amounts for each individual department for FY2009, FY2010 and FY2011.

She said there are four positions whose pay ranges were over the average are Section Leader/Compliance Auditor, Medical Assistant, TB Outreach and Parts Warehouse Supervisor. Four positions whose pay ranges were below the average are Animal Control Supervisor, Farm Museum Coordinator, Nutritionist and Veterans Service Officer. Ms. Jacobson said they must have three comparable matches before they will move a position pay range. With the criteria, there were two positions that are looking to be moved to a higher pay grade which are Animal Control Supervisor and Veterans Service Officer. Judge Self said the current Veterans Service Officer is the most productive officer in Texas. He has processed more claims in the state of Texas than any other service office. Commissioner Webb said the nutritionist numbers are low and wondered why they could not find enough comparable positions. Ms. Jacobson said they have hired nutritionist from hospitals and their pay grade is comparable.

Ms. Jacobson presented the Exempt Salary Analysis. She stated there are 63 employees in the 34 benchmark exempt positions with an average length of service of over nine years and eight of the employees are at the maximum pay range. There are a total of 87 exempt employees and ten are at the maximum pay range. Two positions are under the average which is Counselor for Substance Abuse and Web Development Programmer. She stated Human Resources are not recommending changing the pay scales. (Time: 2:06 p.m.)





Matt Shaheen, Commissioner, Pct. 1




Cheryl Williams, Commissioner, Pct. 2




Joe Jaynes, Commissioner, Pct. 3
