Judge Self called to order the meeting of the Collin County Commissioners' Court at 1:30 p.m. The meeting was recessed into the Collin County Health Care Foundation at 2:40 p.m.

President Self adjourned the meeting of the Collin County Health Care Foundation at 2:40 p.m. and reconvened the meeting of the Collin County Commissioners' Court.

GENERAL DISCUSSION

5. **AI-34174** IT Quarterly presentation, Information Technology.

Caren Skipworth, IT Director, came forward with her quarterly presentation for the Court. Her Power Point presentation included an agenda and a list of IT FY2011 accomplishments. Several projects will roll over for various reasons, which she itemized, and she had three projects which were pending funding from Court. Slides listing IT FY2012 Plan Projects were shown. Software survey results were presented for Odyssey, PeopleSoft, H.T.E. and RMS. Ms. Skipworth stated overall users were satisfied.

An IT infrastructure update was presented at the request of Commissioner Shaheen comparing the old server environment with the new server environment. Due to the VMware – Private Cloud environment, IT was able to reduce the number of systems in their environment and share that resource. Centralization of servers and management of servers is a big benefit to IT. Ms. Skipworth's staff can support the system remotely 365 days a year which negates the need to hire additional staff. With fewer systems, the County consumes less electricity, reduces maintenance costs and reduces physical space. IT cost savings for FY2011 were noted as follows: reduced maintenance cost: \$460,938; reduced cost by process improvements: \$316,804; and reduced cost by innovation: \$573,000, for a total savings of \$1,350,743.

Commissioner Shaheen asked Ms. Skipworth to show the Court a prioritization of projects when she does her quarterly updates. (Time: 2:08 p.m.)

6. AI-34230 Mutual Boundary Roads presentation, Public Works.

Jon Kleinheksel, Public Works, came forward with a Power Point presentation entitled "50 Mile Asphalt Program and Joint Jurisdiction Issues". The program started in 2005 with a scheduled completion date of 2014. The program started with 600 miles to pave, and by fall 2011 there will be about 120 miles left. 86 of those miles have mutual boundaries with another city or county. A mutual boundary road is any recognized road sharing a common boundary with an incorporated municipality. Mr. Kleinheksel stated there are 79 total pending road projects, and he presented a slide listing the cities involved in those projects which account for the 86 miles. Without asphalt, the roads will remain rock roads which present both safety and economic impacts. In FY2010 Public Works spread 34,144 tons of rock to replace material lost through erosion. The cost to replace rock material in FY2010 was \$633,712. In that fiscal year, Public Works processed 783 health letters and oiled 169.2 miles of county road at a cost of \$320,955. Public Works has talked to all the cities with whom they have interlocals and they have all declined to participate due to fiscal concerns. Mr. Kleinheksel used CR 474 in the City of Anna as an example. Their cost for participation to facilitate this project upgrade would be \$37,000.

Mr. Kleinheksel presented options to the court for paving mutual boundary roads:

1. County absorbs the cost of improvements to upgrade only those road segments within county jurisdiction.
2. County absorbs all improvement expenses and requests bordering municipalities to pay all future maintenance costs associated with that road hence forward.
3. Public Works meets with each respective City Manager/City Council and proposes an annual payback plan, i.e. 5-10 years, 10-20 years.

Commissioner Jaynes did not like option number 1. He felt it would set a precedent. Commissioner Williams wanted several options to present to the cities. Judge Self asked about the total cost for the 79 mutual road projects. Mr. Kleinheksel estimated \$50,000 per project, but said he could not quantify that right now. Following further discussion, Commissioner Shaheen said he felt option number 3 made sense. Judge Self asked Mr. Kleinheksel to return with a quantification and asked that this item be revisited. Commissioner Jaynes also asked Mr. Kleinheksel to look at more options. (Time: 1:51 p.m.)

7. AI-34303 Processing Paper Ready Inmates, Sheriff.

Sheriff Terry Box explained a paper ready inmate is someone who has been sentenced in court by a judge and a jury. Processing the paper ready inmate involves getting that paperwork through the District, County, and District Attorney's offices, as well as the court system and then back to the sheriff's office to begin the time the state has to pick up that inmate. The state by law has 45 days from paper ready to pick up an inmate so you want that paper ready date to start as early as possible. The sheriff's office noticed

that the time between sentencing of inmates and the time when they received notification that inmates were paper ready to be moved to state facilities was becoming a significant issue related to jail population. Housing these inmates until they were moved to state facilities was costing the County a significant amount of money. The Sheriff stated discussions were held between the Jail Administrator, the D.A., the District Clerk, courts and court clerks looking for efficiency improvements and ways to reduce the time between sentencing and being paper ready.

They pinpointed the process, which the Sheriff read aloud. A method of tracking was needed and IT became a participant in the process. Through the Odyssey program they are able to track the paperwork and contact any office that is delaying the process. Cooperation among these offices has resulted in a tremendous cost savings for the county. Sheriff Box stated the average days until an inmate was paper ready from January to March 2011 was 44 and the average cost per inmate was \$3,067. Those numbers were reduced to 21 days and \$1,500 for June to August 2011, which resulted in a savings of \$457,752 to the county.

Commissioner Webb asked the Sheriff if the numbers could be brought down even more. Following discussion between the Sheriff and Court members, Commissioner Shaheen praised the Sheriff and the other departments involved for their efficiencies. (Time: 2:16 p.m.)

8. AI-34324 County Policy on C-level designations, County Judge.

Judge Self asked Bill Bilyeu, County Administrator, to come forward and update the court on his plan should this reclass be accepted. Mr. Bilyeu stated reclassifications will be discussed in the next item but he wanted to discuss this C-level designation. He said this designation was for the title of IT Director. In today's market, the title is no longer IT Director; it's Chief Information Officer. Ms. Skipworth is not just responsible for the day to day running of the server, but she is responsible for the future of where the county will be with their software and their products. Mr. Bilyeu said there is no money tied to the new designation and no change to the organization.

Commissioner Shaheen felt it made perfect sense. The Commissioner said the reason for the name change in the private sector is information technology is becoming more and more strategic to a corporation's success. Judge Self noted Ms. Skipworth has already been named CIO of the year in Texas. (Time: 2:19 p.m.)

9. AI-34229 FY2012 Employee Reclassifications, Human Resources.

Cynthia Jacobson, Human Resources, had a list of reclassifications. When HR was going through the salary survey information, they pulled out some positions where there was a particular concern with title or compensation. Ms. Jacobson went through the list

and explained the changes and the reasons for the changes. She noted reclasses don't change pay; employees are just shifted to the new pay grade unless someone is over or under the particular amount of pay for that particular job. Reclassifications have minimal impact from a cost standpoint.

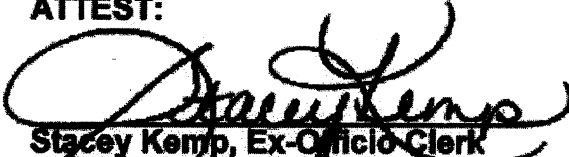
