1. Judge Self called to order the meeting of the **Commissioners' Court Special Session** at 9:00 a.m.
2. Public Comments. There were no public comments presented.

GENERAL DISCUSSION

AI-36081 Canvass the results of the November 6, 2012, General Election, Elections.

Sharon Rowe, Elections Administrator, was present to announce the results of the November 6, 2012, General Election.

304,421 cards were cast in Collin County representing 65.88% of registered voters. Straight party totals for President of the United States: Republican, 133,680; Democrat, 61,441; Libertarian, 1,553; and Green, 294.

For the office of President/Vice-President: Romney/Ryan, 196,888; Obama/Biden, 101,415; Johnson/Gray, 3,712; Stein/Honkala, 733; and write-in votes, 819. Ms. Rowe listed the ballots cast for the declared write-in candidates.

Moving to the office of United States Senator: Ted Cruz, 189,142; Paul Sadler, 96,726; John Jay Myers, 6,740; and David B. Collins, 2,019.

United States Representative, District 3: Sam Johnson, 187,180; District 4, Ralph M. Hall, 10,318; VaLinda Hathcos, 2,384. Fred Rostek was the declared write-in. He received 0 ballots cast. United States Representative, District 32: Pete Sessions,

10,365; Katherine Savers, 5,190; and Seth Hollist, 471. Railroad Commissioner: Christi Craddick, 187,603; Dale Henry, 87,268. Railroad Commissioner, Unexpired Term: Barry Smitherman, 190,643; Jaime Perez, 33,876; and Josh Wendel, 14,358.

Constable, Precinct No. 1, Shane Williams, 26,404; Precinct No. 2, Joe Barton, 22,303, Precinct No. 3, Sammy Knapp, 89,063; and Precinct No. 4, Joe Wright, 62,917.

Ms. Rowe stated there were a total of 4,065 provisional votes cast. Of those, 618 were moved forward and counted.

Commissioner Jaynes asked about mail-in ballots. Just over 600 were returned and added for count. Mail-in ballots from overseas were processed up until November 13, 2012.

Following a brief discussion, a motion was made to accept the canvass as presented. (9:09 a.m.)




