Dear Collin County Resident / Postmaster:

The Collin County Rural Addressing Office is currently correcting emergency addressing, to ensure that there will not be a delay of emergency service to your residence.

To facilitate emergency response, some changes must be made to standardize addresses. Due to the mix of unincorporated property with McKinney city limits, the section of FM 1461 between County Roads 161 and 123/162 will be renamed and addressed to preserve consistency for emergency service dispatch. See the enclosed map.

The proposed address change for the property on the Andrew Stapp Survey, A0833-R00, Tract 1-1, is:
from 3228 FM 1461 to 3798 N LAKE FOREST DR

These addressing recommendations will be made to the Collin County Commissioners' Court at the public court session on September 9, 2013, at 1:30 pm, which you are welcome to attend. The scheduled court date is subject to change – for information on the latest agenda notice go to:

– please DO NOT begin making any changes now.

Upon approval by Commissioners' Court, you will receive official address-change notification from this office, at which time you may begin using the specified new address for your mail correspondence. The post office will continue to forward mail addressed with your old address for a period of three (3) months.

After approval, the Collin Central Appraisal District and your emergency service dispatcher will be notified of this change in the 9-1-1 address database. The telephone company will be informed of the correction in 9-1-1 location, but you must notify them when you are ready to change your billing address.

The two Collin County Department of Public Safety (DPS) offices (in McKinney and Plano) will update the address on drivers licenses at no charge, when shown the official 9-1-1 address correction letter.

Property deeds are not affected by a change in address - even though the deed may reference a physical address, the legal description is the permanent property identifier. If ever needed in the future, this office will provide an address verification letter at no charge.
