Commissioner Webb pulled this item because page 251 under Budget and Finance mentions a \$137,000 discrepancy. The Commissioner could not find the discrepancy and asked if that comment would impact the grant. Jeff May, Auditor, explained the grant was initially \$300,000 for a system called FIDO. It was decided the FIDO system was not the best fit for Collin County, and the grantor allowed the county to go in another direction and upgrade Odyssey to meet its needs. This caused the change in the numbers.

Commissioner Webb also questioned whether the amount of the grant was \$436,240 or \$426,240 since both amounts were referenced in the documents. Mr. May said there were iPads on this grant which were removed because iPads were approved by another CJD (Criminal Justice Division) grant. Removing the iPads brought the amount of the grant down to \$426,240. A motion was made to approve the item. (Time: 1:39 p.m.)

This would free up some RTR (Regional Toll Revenues) funds which could then be moved to US 75 since it is still uncertain how much US 75 will cost. This item was approved.

The other item of action was the funding for the transit services in Collin County TAPS (Texoma Area Paratransit System) for FY2014 which is being funded by transit RTR monies, not Collin County monies. Judge Self mentioned 2% of RTR dollars are reserved which is where the funds are coming from. The Commissioner also mentioned the Forecast 2040 Demographic Update regarding a new study done for COG (Council of Governments). The report has some good employer numbers showing how much employment is driving this area. (Time: 1:42 p.m.)


EXECUTIVE SESSION
