The check is a portion of the rebates the County receives from various electrical programs. Judge Self said the check is just one way the County supports this great organization; the County pays the rent for the CAC staff, has investigators and prosecutors at the CAC and gives jurors the option to donate their juror pay to the CAC. Ms. McLean was honored to accept the check on behalf of the CAC of Collin County and the almost 60,000 children who have been served. Ms. McLean said the mission of the CAC is to provide safety, healing and justice for Collin County children who are victimized by child abuse or neglect. This is accomplished through a multidisciplinary team approach by cohousing all the professionals who handle child abuse cases in one building. This way the child comes in one door and gets all they need to heal. Last year the conviction rate for cases handled by the CAC was 92%. Next year the CAC will celebrate 25 years of providing service to Collin County children. (Time: 1:41 p.m.)
