- Increase access to providers in Collin County
- Coordinate with Medicaid health plans (HMOs)
- Ongoing communication with all stakeholders
- Ensure transparency



## **Gaining Efficiencies**

Reduce crises resulting in higher levels of care

Proactive eligibility reviews and client benefits enrollment

**Preventative outpatient focus** 

Expand sources of funding and reimbursements (PAP, TCOOMI, MAC, etc.)

#### **Population Covered Under State Contract**

Crisis Hotline and Mobile Crisis: No restrictions

All other services: Indigent with serious mental illness or substance abuse/addictions

Medicaid-eligible: Services from Medicaid Health plans
