GENERAL DISCUSSION

5. <u>AI-42543</u> Award P25 Trunked Radio System Replacement (RFP No. 2016-020) and further authorize the Purchasing Agent to finalize and execute the agreement, Sheriff.

Michalyn Raines, Purchasing, introduced Bobby Jones, Black and Veatch, to give a presentation on the award of the RFP (Request for Price) for the P25 Trunked Radio System Replacement Project.

Mr. Jones said in 2014 a needs analysis of the current system was conducted resulting in two major complaints: 1) poor radio coverage, especially in buildings; and 2) radio system congestion, the need for more open channels. In November 2015 the long and thorough RFP process began. The RFP required vendors to propose a "baseline" county-owned system and allowed vendors to propose "alternative solutions" if the vendor proposed the "baseline" system. Three proposals were received from two vendors. Vendor A proposed a county-owned system with 11 tower sites. Vendor B

proposed a county-owned system with 11 tower sites as well as a proposal for a partnership with an existing system within Collin County with 18 tower sites which included the four existing tower sites. The evaluation team which was comprised of eight members from the Sheriff's Office, Purchasing, Fire Marshal, Information Technology, Public Works, Maintenance, Dispatch and Patrol preformed a thorough evaluation of the proposals.

The recommendation to the County is to partner with the existing P25 Radio System. It is the best technical solution solving the radio coverage and system congestion problems. Mr. Jones reviewed maps of the current radio system with four tower sites versus the new radio system with 18 tower sites. The new system is a simulcast system which will be seamless as the users travel through the County. For example, if you are in Celina and for some reason the Celina signal is blocked by a building you will still have signal coming in at different angles from the surrounding towers.

The advantages of the partnership include: 1) substantial cost savings of \$1.7 million on the initial system purchase; 2) substantial cost savings of \$300,000-\$400,000 per year on after warranty maintenance/service; 3) better radio coverage with more transmitter sites; 4) more channel capacity; 5) faster on-site service response and system restoration during system failures; and 6) the County does not have to give up control of the system.

Judge Self said a tremendous amount of work has been done on what the small city police departments, fire departments and independent school district police departments will need but asked where those fit in the contract before the Court. Mr. Jones said the contract is not for the purchase of those smaller agencies but does establish long-term pricing for what they will need to buy. With no further discussion, a motion was made to approve the item. (Time: 1:55 p.m.)
