Commissioner Webb is supportive of the item but questioned the capacity based on two different estimate numbers for population growth in 15 years. One estimate, from the GIS (Geographic Information Services) Department, was an increased population for Collin County of 500% and the consultant estimate was only an increase of 25% over 15 years. The Commissioner does not want to spend the \$400,000 if there will not be enough space to handle the capacity down the line. Bobby Jones, Black & Veatch, said the 500% estimate of growth is mostly in the major cities of McKinney and Frisco; therefore, those calls are not taken into account when doing the analysis for Collin County.
