Remarks: WLJ - Allows a county of 30k or less to satisfy level IV trauma facility designation requirements relating to physicians through telemedicine.

- [HB 872](#) [Hefner, Cole\(R\)](#) Relating to financial assistance paid to the survivors of certain law enforcement officers and employees killed in the line of duty.

Remarks: MGJ - Expands survivor benefits for law enforcement to include jailer, a county jailor or guard.

- [HB 878](#) [Bell, Cecil\(R\)](#) Relating to a limitation on increases in the appraised value of real property for ad valorem tax purposes.
Remarks: aph - changes the annual appraisal cap to 5% per year and applies that cap to 'real property' not just the homestead. Also provides the appraisal cap extends to a surviving spouse when the property is transferred to the spouse upon death.

- [HB 881](#) [Bell, Cecil\(R\)](#) Relating to the right of a parent of a deceased person to view the person's body before an autopsy is performed.
Remarks: WLJ - Currently a parent of a child, under 18, can view the child's body prior to the JP or medical examiner taking control. This bill wants to expand the right to any parent regardless of the age of the person who is deceased.

Remarks: WLJ - Requires the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement to develop a state model policy and training materials regarding de-escalation and proportionate response to reduce force by peace officers.


Requires law enforcement to first use nonlethal force. Requires a peace officer who uses force, or directs another to use force to use the de-escalation techniques mentioned above.

Remarks: WLJ - Creates a class b misdemeanor for intentionally misrepresenting to law enforcement at a port of entry that a child is a family member

Remarks: WLJ - Repeals the light-duty motor vehicle program including removing eligibility under the TERP program.

 [HB 890](#) [Israel, Celia\(D\)](#) Relating to the authority to conduct a runoff primary election by mail in certain counties.

Remarks: WLJ - Allows a state party chairman to call for a runoff primary election to be held only by mail if fewer than 100 votes were cast in the general election, and a runoff election is required in the county only for statewide offices filled by voters of more than one county.

Remarks: aph - eliminates the administrative fees used to enforce motor vehicle taxes. The 1% is controlled by Comptroller currently.

Remarks: MGV - Expands information on voter history including a provisional vote and the reason.

 [HB 900](#) [Israel, Celia\(D\)](#) Relating to the act of smoking tobacco in a vehicle with a child present.

Remarks: WLJ - Creates a \$15 civil penalty for smoking in a vehicle with a child who is in a carseat. Subsequent violations are \$150. Allows a parent to attend parenting classes. An officer can't pull a vehicle over only to ticket for this.

Remarks: JBD - Assault is felony if victim is pregnant.

Remarks: JBD - Smuggling to include encouraging persons to trespass on agricultural land.

- HB 905 Bernal, Diego(D) Relating to an exemption from ad valorem taxation of the total appraised value of the residence homestead of an unpaid caregiver of an individual.
- Remarks:** aph - exempts 100% of the value of a qualified caregiver's homestead from local taxes.

- HB 913 Shaheen, Matt(R) Relating to the calculation of the ad valorem rollback tax rate of a taxing unit other than a school district.
- Remarks:** aph - adjust the rollback rate from 8% to 4%.

- HB 914 Thompson, Senfronia(D) Relating to the regulation of bingo games.
- Remarks:** MGV - Shifts responsibility to the Texas Lottery Commission from a license holder to conduct bingo for sending a copy of a license and a written notice of license issuance to the appropriate governing body. On a quarterly basis, requires 50% of amount collected as prize tax to be remitted to the Commission and a county or municipality that imposed the prize tax. Creates an appeals process for a county or municipality to challenge the termination of entitlement to the prize tax share.

- HB 915 Shaheen, Matt(R) Relating to the sale of fireworks during and before the Diwali holiday.
- Remarks:** Allows fireworks on Diwali Day. Typically in October/September. No commissioners court approval required.

- HB 916 Guillen, Ryan(D) Relating to the exemption of rural transit districts from motor fuel taxes.
- Remarks:** aph - exempts rural transit districts from motor fuel taxes.

- HB 921 Rosenthal, Jon (F)(D) Relating to the intake and disposition records of animal shelters and releasing agencies.
- Remarks:** VRS - Mandates that animal shelters (public and private), humane societies and pounds prepare and maintain records on the animals in their facilities. Requires shelters and other animal care facilities to prepare and maintain monthly reports, although it permits these records to be stored off of the premises. Requires that these reports be kept for 3 years, and that they be posted to the facility's website or other public posting location.

- HB 923 Zedler, Bill(R) Relating to coverage of an alternative treatment after the approval of a utilization review.

Remarks: Wlj - requires a health insurance plan cover an alternative procedure if it's approved by the FDA and does not cost more than the conventional treatment.

Relating to county surety bond requirements for concrete batch plants.

Remarks: WLJ - allows Commissioner's Court to require a surety bond by concrete plant operators to repair road damage caused by the plant operations.

Relating to the duties of a magistrate to inform an arrested person of consequences of a plea of guilty or nolo contendere.

Remarks: JBD - Magistrates to tell arrestees that plea could hinder service in US military.

Relating to use of force or deadly force in defense of a person.

Remarks: JBD - Repeals Texas' "stand your ground" justifications for use of deadly force.

Relating to equalizing compensation for certain wrongfully imprisoned persons.

Remarks: JBD - Increases state compensation to those wrongfully convicted who were compensated before 1/1/2009 (when compensation was less than current).

Relating to posting of election information on the secretary of state's and each county's Internet website.


Remarks: WLJ - Requires a county post on the county website location of each polling place. Requires the SOS to adopt procedures that require county elections administrators to submit contact information of the county election officer to the SOS to be posted on the SOS website and locations of polling places, early voting polling places for the SOS website. Requires county elections administrator to post on the county website details on the location of election office, each polling place information including days and hours open. When an order changing a precinct boundary is posted it must be on the county website for three weeks.

Remarks: JBD - Makes "johns" guilty of trafficking if they engage in sex with person who is trafficked, without any requirement that johns know person is victim of trafficking.

Remarks: Wlj - makes general Election Day an official state holiday.

 [HB 937](#) [Davis, Sarah\(R\)](#) Relating to health benefit plan coverage of prescription contraceptive drugs.

Remarks: Wlj - requires a health benefit plan to cover a 12 month contraceptive prescription (1 time RX)

 [HB 940](#) [Davis, Sarah\(R\)](#) Relating to the unlawful restraint of a dog.

Companions: [SB 295](#) Lucio, Eddie(D) (Identical)

Remarks: VRS - Creates a Class C misdemeanor offense for leaving a dog in an unlawfully restrictive manner (no shelter, short leash, improper collar, no access to water, etc). If previously convicted of this offense, the next offense is a Class B misdemeanor. If this offense constitutes an offense under any other law, then the offender can be prosecuted for this law, the other law or both. Does not preempt political subdivision requirements regarding dog restraint as long as it's comparable or more substantial than this requirement or relates to an issue not covered in this requirement.

Remarks: aph - changes homestead exemption to a 'real property' exemption for property tax and establishes a process to transfer that exemption to a surviving spouse for the next tax year as long as the real property remains in ownership.

 **HB 947** Metcalf, Will(R) Relating to exemptions from the motor vehicle use tax for a motor vehicle brought into this state by an active duty member of the United States armed forces or the member's spouse.


Remarks: aph - exempts vehicles purchased out-of-state from sales tax if the vehicle is brought into TX by active duty members or their spouse.

 **HB 948** Metcalf, Will(R) Relating to the period for which certain land owned by a religious organization for the purpose of expanding a place of religious worship or constructing a new place of religious worship may be exempted from ad valorem taxat


Remarks: aph - changes the property tax exemption for land of a religious organization from 6 years to 10 years.

 **HB 949** Minjarez, Ina(D) Relating to the punishment for the offense of aggravated assault.

Remarks: JBD - Penalty for aggravated assault is increased to 1st degree if victim suffer paralysis.

 **HB 950** Lucio III, Eddie(D) Relating to the authority of an appraisal review board to determine the appraised value of property that is the subject of a protest to be an amount greater than the appraised value as shown in the appraisal records.

Remarks: aph - Limits the ARB from increasing the value of property to a higher level than set by the chief appraiser after a protest by the taxpayer.

 **HB 951** Stucky, Lynn(R) Relating to a common characteristic or use project in a

public improvement district in certain municipalities.

Companions: SB 386 Nelson, Jane(R) (Identical)

Remarks: aph - add the City of Denton to be able to use hotel occupancy tax for the purpose of building a convention or activity center.

 HB 952 Hernandez, Ana(D) Relating to diaper changing stations in restrooms in buildings accessible to the public.


Remarks: MGV - Requires a diaper changing station in restrooms accessible to the public in at least one restroom if unisex or at least one restroom designated for each gender.

 HB 955 Thompson, Senfronia(D) Relating to eligibility requirements for student loan repayment assistance for certain mental health professionals.


Remarks: Wlj - allows for tuition forgiveness for mental health providers that are board certified and serve children with behavior health issues via remote services.

 HB 956 Miller, Rick(R) Relating to the dissolution of county assistance districts.


Remarks: MGV - Allows the governing body of a county assistance district to petition the county commissioners court to dissolve the district.

 HB 957 Miller, Rick(R) Relating to the use of sales tax revenue collected under certain contracts.


Remarks: aph - authorizes water districts within Fort Bend Co to use portions of sales tax receipts consummated within the boundaries of the district to be used for drainage and road projects for the benefit of the citizens of the district.

 HB 958 Miller, Rick(R) Relating to the release and inclusion of extraterritorial jurisdiction by a municipality involving certain areas.

Remarks: JBD - Permits residents of Fort Bend to petition Houston to be excluded from the city's ETJ.

 HB 962 Miller, Rick(R) Relating to the operation of a motor vehicle passing a pedestrian or a person operating a bicycle.

Remarks: aph - creates a buffer zone for vehicles passing bicyclists operating on a highway or street. Zone is 3 feet for a

passenger and 6 ft for a commercial vehicle.

HB 964 Cole, Sheryl (F)(D) Relating to certain claims against the administrator of employment benefits for the employees of a political subdivision.

Companions: SB 448 Watson, Kirk(D) (Identical)

Remarks: JBD - A person who administers an employee benefits plan or program of a political subdivision is liable for a claim arising from those duties if otherwise liable under the law, regardless of governmental immunity.

HB 967 Miller, Rick(R) Relating to tickets used to play pull-tab bingo.

Remarks: aph - clarifies the types of tickets that can be used as a 'pull-tab' for the purposes of bingo games.

HB 969 Springer, Drew(R) Relating to the authority of a political subdivision to regulate the removal by a landowner of noxious or invasive plant species or brush species detrimental to water conservation from the landowner's property.

Remarks: aph - places a limit on local governments from prohibiting a land owner from removing 'noxious brush' that is detrimental to water conservation.

HB 970 Walle, Amando(D) Relating to notice requirements for leased residential property, manufactured home lots, or commercial property located in a flood zone.

Remarks: aph - requires property owners to notify lessees of the fact their lease is located in a FEMA flood zone and notice the lessee may need flood insurance to cover property or belongings.

HB 972 Biedermann, Kyle(R) Relating to repealing the authority of a county to regulate hunting with bows and arrows in certain subdivisions.


Remarks: JBD - Repeals the authority of counties to regulate hunting by bow/arrow on lots under 10 acres in unincorporated area.

HB 977 Thierry, Shawn(D) Relating to creating the criminal offense of financial abuse of an elderly individual.

Remarks: JBD - Creates new felony offense for financial exploitation of elderly person.

 **HB 978** Beckley, Michelle (F)(D) Relating to certain statutory changes to reflect and address same-sex marriages and parenting relationships and to the removal of provisions regarding the criminality or unacceptability of homosexual conduct.

SB 251 Rodriguez, Jose(D) (Refiled from 85R Session)
SB 153 Rodriguez, Jose(D) (Identical)

Remarks: JBD - Revises statutes to reflect same-sex marriages and civil unions. Repeals criminal statute regarding homosexual conduct.

 **HB 979** Hernandez, Ana(D) Relating to the creation of DNA records for certain defendants for inclusion in the DNA database system.

Remarks: JBD - Adds offenses for which DNA samples are required of defendant upon conviction - assault, deadly conduct, and unlawful restraint.

 **HB 980** Beckley, Michelle (F)(D) Relating to the repeal of the criminal offense of homosexual conduct.

Remarks: JBD - repeals criminal offense of homosexual conduct and requirements that certain educational materials state that homosexual conduct is not an acceptable lifestyle and criminal.

 **HB 981** Parker, Tan(R) Relating to the offense of money laundering.

Remarks: JBD - Offense of money laundering updated to cover digital currency.

 **HB 982** Parker, Tan(R) Relating to the administration of "pay for success" contracts for state agencies.

Remarks: JBD - Permits the costs of "pay for success" contracts entered into by the state or state agency to be paid by gifts, grants and donations.

 HB 984 Parker, Tan(R)

Relating to requirements for new or increased municipal fees.

Remarks: JBD - Applicable to only municipalities as filed. A budget that includes new or increased fees must have statements on cover sheets regarding those fees. Separate vote required to ratify use of new/revised fee revenue. Cities in counties above 30,000 to create opt-in web notification services regarding approved fee amounts.

Relating to the effect of certain agreements with a collective bargaining organization on certain state-funded public work contracts.

Companions: HB 648 Parker, Tan(R) (Refiled from 85R Session)

Remarks: WLJ - Provides that a governmental entity awarding a public work contract funded with state money, including the issuance of debt guaranteed by the state, may not prohibit, require, discourage, or encourage a person bidding on the public work contract, including a contractor or subcontractor, from entering into or adhering to an agreement with a collective bargaining organization relating to the project; or discriminate based on the person's involvement in the agreement, including the person's status or lack of status as a party to the agreement or willingness or refusal to enter into the agreement.

 HB 987 White, James(R)

Relating to personal identification documents for foster children or youth, homeless children or youth, and unaccompanied youth.

Remarks: VRS - Requires that registrars and county clerks issue birth certificates to foster children or homeless youth without a fee or parental consent. Allows a foster child or homeless youth to get a personal ID and/or drivers license by presenting their birth certificate and a letter or other certifying document that verifies their housing status and exempts them from the license fee.

 HB 990 Gutierrez, Roland(D)

Relating to a study by the Texas Water Development Board and the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality regarding the effects of the construction of a border wall on storm drainage and other environmental matters in this state.

Remarks: aph - directs TCEQ and TWDB to study the impacts on storm drainage, water discharge, and environmental contamination a boarder wall would create.

Relating to the acquisition of real property by an entity

with eminent domain authority.

Remarks: JBD - As filed, applies only to private entities with eminent domain authority. Requires offers to be based on appraisals (which counties already do). Requires public hearings regarding projects before offers can be made. Creates a penalty if the amount awarded by special commissioners exceeds the initial offer by a certain percent, with penalty increasing as that delta increases.

 [HB 995](#) Collier, Nicole(D) Relating to requiring certain employers to provide paid leave to employees.

Remarks: JBD - Employers with 50 or more employees must provide paid leave - 1 hour for each 30 hours worked up to max of 40 hours per calendar year. State, counties, municipalities, charities, and religious organizations specifically excluded.

Remarks: JBD - Provides whistleblower protection to an employee that reports violation of law to (1) employee's supervisor; (2) a person or office designated by the employer for such reports; or (3) any member of the employer's HR staff.

 [HB 1009](#) Metcalf, Will(R) Relating to the prosecution of the offense of possessing a weapon in certain prohibited places associated with schools or postsecondary educational institutions.

Remarks: JBD - Expands ability for handgun licensees to carry weapons on private college campuses and in any building

owned or controlled by a public or private postsecondary educational institution.

 **HB 1010** Paul, Dennis(R)

Relating to state and regional flood planning.

Remarks: MGV - Charges TX Water Development Board (TWDB) with developing a state flood plan by September 2021 and every 5 years after, incorporating regional flood plans. Requires plan to include a ranked list of ongoing, proposed flood control projects organized by watershed.

Creates regional flood planning process with TWDB-designated flood planning regions corresponding to each watershed. Authorizes TWDB to establish initial flood planning group with reps from each flood planning region, TWDB, Parks and Wildlife, Dept of Ag, State Soil and Water Conservation Board. Allows for adequate representation from additional designees from the public, counties, municipalities, industries, ags, environmental interests, utilities, river authorities, water districts.

Charges planning group with preparing a draft regional plan and hold public meetings. Requires plan to include a list of projects necessary to meet flood planning needs for 10 years. Authorizes TWDB to approve regional plans.

Requires each plan to include condition and functionality of flood control infrastructure; land use changes and population growth; and highlight flood prone areas and flood control solutions. Requires participating counties to hold public meetings and requires the planning group to hold at least 1 public meeting. Authorizes TWDB to designate regions corresponding to each river basin. Sets January 10, 2023 as the deadline to submit regional plans.

Proposing a constitutional amendment relating to the effect of a sale of property on the tax lien on the property to secure the payment of ad valorem taxes, penalties, and interest.
