years for the purposes of school taxes. The lifetime exemption would be equal to the lesser of 120% of the tax due during the first tax year or the lowest amount during those years. The exemption would transfer to a surviving spouse as long as it is owned and occupied. Tax would

exclude new additions or improvements.
