Advanced meters and meter information networks have been deployed across Texas in ERCOT and Entergy service areas. Proponents (industry) supporters cite cost savings and operational benefits, including enhanced energy management tools and faster outage response times.

ERCOT and Entergy utilities have deployed advanced metering systems by filing with the PUC, and then recovered the costs associated with the deployment through a surcharge authorized by the Leg. Current law is ambiguous as to whether the statute and PUC rules relating to the surcharge and customer protections would apply to deployment of advanced meters and meter information networks in non-ERCOT area of the state – hence this bill.

The bills clarify that the surcharge and applicable customer protections adopted by PUC related to the deployment of advanced metering systems would also allow areas outside ERCOT, if TDSPs there choose to deploy advanced meters and metering information networks, to do so in the same manner as authorized for ERCOT utilities and Entergy. The bills require and ensure that a deployment plan approved contains the same customer protections, data security provisions, and opt-out provisions provided by PUC for ERCOT utilities and Entergy.
