If an investigation does not result in punitive action against the firefighter but results in a written reprimand or adverse finding the reprimand, finding or determination may not be placed in the firefighter's personnel file unless the firefighter is first given an opportunity to read and sign the document; and the firefighter may respond in writing to the reprimand or adverse finding not later than the 10th day after the firefighter is asked to sign the document, and such response shall be placed in the firefighter's personnel file. A firefighter who receives a punitive action may elect to appeal the action by filing a written response not later than the 10th day after the date the firefighter receives written notice of the punitive action from the department head. An investigation of a firefighter that directly relates to the facts and circumstances of an offense for which the firefighter has been convicted is exempt from the requirements of the bill if the investigation: (a) involves family violence: and (b) is punishable as a felony or Class A or B misdemeanor.
