enforcement, and utility providers.

this effort. JBD - Establishes a commission for review the Penal Code and other criminal statutes for necessary revision. Moves some non-Penal Code offenses to the Penal Code. Revises (including lowering offense levels) for some

non-Penal Code offenses.

a stand on private property.

filing deadlines to the website. Requires political subdivisions to post a tax information website containing info for taxpayers

to obtain meetings, rates, and elections for officers.

Remarks: JBD - CS - Sub adds 2 new reporting requirements on courts:

(1) when charge filed with court, court must notify DPS if interlock is still required; and (2) if defendant convicted, court must notify DPS if interlock required as condition of sentence.

MGV - Creates a central database containing information about defendants required to have an ignition interlock device. Requires magistrate or court to submit the name of the defendant and expiration date of restriction to DPS for inclusion in database maintained by DPS.

Corrections

Blanco, Cesar(D) Relating to defense economic readjustment zones.

Remarks: MGV - Allows governing body of a county to apply to TX

Economic Development Bank for designation as a defense readjustment project any qualified project located within a municipality. An interlocal agreement between county and municipality must be entered before application is made. Agreement must state which governing body will have administration authority.

Changes criteria for readjustment zone designation to automatically designating a municipality or county as a readjustment zone if it is a defense-dependent community. Allows a municipality or county with a designated readjustment zone to also be included in an enterprise zone. Redefines defense-dependent community to municipality or county containing or has the power of a defense based development authority.

Changes period of designation as indefinite as long as qualifications are met. Limits number of defense readjustment projects in each zone. Changes job allocation numbers and amount of capital investment made to determine business eligibility for tax refunds.

The HB 1421 Israel, Celia(D)

Removes ability of governing body of a municipality or county with a readjustment zone from prioritizing the area for local incentives (commu nity development block grant money, industrial revenue bonds, job training funds) and adopting a plan for police protection in the zone.

Changes tax refund eligibility to all taxable items purchased for use by qualified business site.

International Relations/Economic Dev

Relating to the use of a county early voting polling

place by a political subdivision.

Remarks: WLj - CS - substitute includes a requirement for a political subdivision to designate an eligible county polling place for an election held on the May uniform election date as the polling place established by a county for the most recent election held on the November uniform election date to the extent possible.

> WLJ - provide that political subdivisions holding elections in November may not designate as an early voting polling place a location other than an eligible county polling place, unless each eligible county polling place located in the political subdivision is designated as an early voting polling place for the election.

Elections

Relating to cybersecurity of voter registration lists and other election-related documents, systems, and

technology.

Remarks: WLJ - CS - substitute extends the cybersecurity duties for a

voter registrar or county clerk to a county election officer.

Changes the required rules adopted by SOS to include the adoption of rules defining classes of protected election data and to specify that the best practices rules are those identifying and reducing risk to the electronic use, storage, and transmission of election data and the security of election systems.

The substitute includes a requirement for a county election officer to request a cybersecurity assessment.

WLJ - Requires the SOS to adopt rules to establish best practices for storing election data electronically. Requires SOS to offer training on an annual basis to county staff, upon request of the county.

Requires a voter registrar or clerk to request training on cyber security on an annual basis if state funds are available. If a registrar or clerk become aware of a breach they must immediately notify SOS. If state funds are provided all devices with access to election data must comply to the highest extent possible.

Kolkhorst, Lois(R)

Relating to emergency and disaster management, response, and recovery.

Remarks: MGV - ENG Requires emergency credentialing work group to submit report to Legislature and Gov. CS Requires Tx Division of Emergency Management to develop a model guide for local officials regarding disaster response, recovery.

Creates emergency credentialing work group.

1 SB 7 Creighton, Brandon(R) Relating to flood control planning and the funding of flood planning, mitigation, and infrastructure projects.

MGV - ENG Adds nonstructural or natural flood control Remarks:

strategies as eligible flood projects.

Senate Proposed Language: Limits grant or loan to 75% of the portion of project cost that is paid w/ money other than fed money. By September 1, 2031, transfers remaining balance of account to be transferred to the flood plan implementation account.

Amends Floodplain Management Account as a special fund, administered by TX Water Development Board, used for grants, data collection for flood control planning and renames it the TX Infrastructure Resiliency Fund (TIRF). Creates four subaccounts: Floodplain Management (continues to be used for grants, data collection, stream gaging, and outreach), Harvey Recovery, Flood Plan Implementation, Army Corps Projects. Prioritizes projects based on TDEM recommendations, emergency need, funded partially by fed matching funds, increase water supply. Defines flood project as drainage, flood mitigation, or flood control project. Establishes TIRF Advisory Committee (existing members of SWIFT and TDEM). Requires quarterly reports from state agencies that disburse fed dollars for flood-related activity. Adds TWDB transparency requirements - post info on website re: use of resiliency fund.

For guardianship proceeding costs, allows for payment out of the county treasury if a guardianship of the estate has been created for the ward and court determines it's not in ward's best interest

to pay.
