- HB 1**      **Zerwas, John(R)**      General Appropriations Bill.
- Remarks:** WLJ - House version of the budget.
- Last Action:** 3-27-19 H Passed (Vote: Y:149/N: 0)
- HB 3**      **Huberty, Dan(R)**      Relating to public school finance and public education.
- Remarks:** school finance bill which will increase \$ for public schools, scale back recapture, fund merit pay increases for teachers. Bill provides \$6.3 billion for schools and \$2.7B to lower property taxes
- Last Action:** 3-27-19 H Calendar rule adopted requiring proposed floor amendments  
be filed with the Chief Clerk by 5:00 p.m., Monday, April 1
- HB 8**      **Neave, Victoria(D)**      Relating to the statute of limitations for certain sexual offenses and the collection, analysis, and preservation of evidence of sexual assault and other sex offenses.
- Remarks:** JBD - HCS - new provisions regarding destruction of evidence. Requires victim notification and opportunity to object.
- WLJ - Requires an audit of untested rape kits to determine the number, status and where the kit is in Texas. Creates timelines from when the kit is submitted, tested and sent for analysis.
- Abates the statute of limitation for sexual assault and aggravated sexual assault until the rape kit is tested. Prohibits law enforcement agencies from destroying rape kits related to an uncharged or unsolved case until the statute of limitation expires, or 50 years.
- Increases the time the Texas Department of Public Safety maintains rape kits classified as "non-reports" from two years to five years.

- HB 13**      **Phelan, Dade(R)**      Relating to flood planning, mitigation, and infrastructure projects.

**Remarks:** MGV - CS Charges State Soil and Water Conservation Board with the 10-yr dam repair and maintenance plan. Requires application to include whether project could use be used for water supply purposes.

Appropriates \$3.26B from ESF and creates the flood infrastructure fund as a special fund outside of the general fund to be administered by the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB) to award or loan state dollars to political subdivisions in cooperation with others in a region to encourage development of nonstructural and structural flood mitigation.

Authorizes the following for use of fund: to make a loan to an eligible political subdivision at or below market interest rates for a flood project; to make a grant, low interest loan, or zero interest loan to an eligible political subdivision for a flood project to serve an outside area of a MSA or an economically distressed area (median household income that isn't greater than 85% of median state income); to make a loan at or below market interest rates for planning and design costs, permitting costs, or costs associated with state or fed regulatory activities; to make a grant to an eligible political subdivision to provide matching funds to enable participation in a federal program for a flood project; source of revenue or security for payment of principal and interest on bonds issued by the board; and pay expenses of board in administering of fund.

Martinez, Armando(D)

Relating to prohibiting the reckless discharge of a firearm.

**Remarks:** JBD - CS - immaterial changes WLJ - Creates a Class A Misdemeanor offense for reckless discharge of a firearm. Felony if it creates serious bodily injury or death.

**Last Action:** 3-26-19 H Reported from committee as substituted House Criminal Jurisprudence

  HB 123

White, James(R)

Relating to the issuance of personal identification documents for foster children, homeless children or youth, and unaccompanied youth.

**Remarks:** VRS - CS - Requires the state registrar to provide the dept. with a foster youth's birth certificate if requested; if the dept. can't obtain it from the state registrar they can request it from the county clerk or local registrar who then must provide the document without a fee or parental consent. Clarifies what criteria are needed to qualify as an unaccompanied youth, foster child or homeless child.

Allows unaccompanied youths, foster children and homeless children to get vital records with a copy of their birth certificate, and removes the fee for obtaining copies of vital records for these minors. Exempts foster children, unaccompanied youths and homeless children from the drivers license fee.

  HB 155 Canales, Terry(D)

Relating to notice provided to a court regarding a defendant confined in a state jail felony facility.

**Remarks:** JBD - HFA - Judge must request notice, but can submit one request covering all defendants sentenced in the judge's court.

WLJ - Requires TDCJ to electronically notify, within 60 days of intake, sentencing court the date the defendant will have served 75 days in the facility.

  HB 364 Tinderholt, Tony(R)

Relating to the creation of a central database containing information about defendants required to have an ignition interlock device installed on a motor vehicle.

**Companions:** SB 558 Huffman, Joan(R) (Identical)  
2-21-19 S Introduced and referred to committee on Senate Criminal Justice

**Remarks:** JBD - HFA - DPS doesn't have to create new database as long as required data can be put into existing database, like driver license data.

JBD - CS - Sub adds 2 new reporting requirements on courts: (1) when charge filed with court, court must notify DPS if interlock is still required; and (2) if defendant convicted, court must notify DPS if interlock required as condition of sentence.

MGV - Creates a central database containing information about defendants required to have an ignition interlock device. Requires magistrate or court to submit the name of the defendant and expiration date of restriction to DPS for inclusion in database maintained by DPS.

  HB 390 Blanco, Cesar(D)

Relating to defense economic readjustment zones.

**Remarks:** MGV - CS Establishes that city or county encompassing any part of federally owned or operated military installation that is functioning on May 19, 1997.

Allows governing body of a county to apply to TX Economic Development Bank for designation as a defense readjustment project any qualified project located within a municipality. An interlocal agreement between county and municipality must be entered before application is made. Agreement must state which governing body will have administration authority.

Changes criteria for readjustment zone designation to automatically designating a municipality or county as a readjustment zone if it is a defense-dependent community. Allows a municipality or county with a designated readjustment zone to also be included in an enterprise zone. Redefines defense-dependent community to municipality or county containing or has the power of a defense based development authority.

Changes period of designation as indefinite as long as qualifications are met. Limits number of defense readjustment

projects in each zone. Changes job allocation numbers and amount of capital investment made to determine business eligibility for tax refunds.

Removes ability of governing body of a municipality or county with a readjustment zone from prioritizing the area for local incentives (community development block grant money, industrial revenue bonds, job training funds) and adopting a plan for police protection in the zone.

Changes tax refund eligibility to all taxable items purchased for use by qualified business site.

  HB 616 Neave, Victoria(D)

Relating to compensation for a portion of a forensic medical examination of a sexual assault survivor and for the evidence collection kit required for the examination.

**Remarks:** JBD - H Proposed - Clarifies AG responsible for reimbursing healthcare providers for forensic exam and rape kits (rather than local law enforcement).

JBD - Will permit health care facilities that provide rape forensic medical exams to submit claims for payment to the Sex Assault Program Fund administered by the AG.

  HB 659 White, James(R)

Relating to the collection of information regarding the parental status of inmates of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice.

**Remarks:** JBD - ENG - Limited to minor children and those in school.  
JBD - Requires TDCJ to annually gather information on number of prisoners who have children.

  HB 703 Harris, Cody (F)(R)

Relating to the confidentiality of birth records.

**Remarks:** MGV - CS Increases from 75 to 90 years that a birth record becomes public information.

Increases from 75 to 125 years that a birth record becomes public information.

**Last Action:** 3-28-19 H Reported from committee as substituted House Public Health

  HB 833 Hernandez, Ana(D)

Relating to the creation of a statewide alert system for missing military members.

**Remarks:** MGV - CS - No amendments of interest. Creates a statewide alert system for any missing military member who suffers from a mental illness, including post-traumatic stress disorder, or a traumatic brain injury

-   **HB 1028** Guillen, Ryan(D) Relating to increasing the criminal penalties for certain offenses committed in a disaster area or an evacuated area.
- Remarks:** JBD - CS - nonsubstantive change JBD - Add burglary of coin operated machine and burglary of vehicle to offenses with enhanced punishment when committed in disaster or evacuation zone.

-   **HB 1374** Hernandez, Ana(D) Relating to grants for the development and operation of pretrial intervention programs for defendants who are the primary caretaker of a child.
- Remarks:** JBD - H Proposed - Grants may be for pretrial intervention for pregnant defendants in addition to primary caregivers of kids.
- JBD - Permits Community Justice Assistance Division to award grants to counties, cities and probation departments for pretrial intervention programs for defendants who are primary caregivers to children under 18.

-   **HB 1409** Ashby, Trent(R) Relating to the qualification of land for appraisal for ad valorem tax purposes as timber land or restricted-use timber land.

- Remarks:** aph - CS adds the federal sites for eminent domain proceedings. In essence, same bill. - companion for HB 1409, prevents a chief appraiser from considering portions of a tract of land with a restricted-use timber designation from an increased valuation if that land is used for other purposes as long as the whole tract qualifies for timber production.

**Remarks:** WLJ - Requires HHSC to create a pilot program to assist up  
to 500 families to acquire self-sufficiency. Would continue  
SNAP and TANF for up to 0 months regardless of eligibility  
requirements slowly reducing the benefits.

Relating to the regulation of the sale of  
dextromethorphan to minors.

**Remarks:** WLJ - Creates a civil penalty to a business for the sale of  
cough syrup to minors.

Relating to the administration and collection of sales  
and use taxes applicable to sales involving marketplace  
providers.

**Remarks:** aph - CS lege council version. - Wayfare bill to create a  
'Marketplace Provider' definition in the Tax Code to create a  
nexus for internet sales. Treats Marketplace providers like  
retailers for the purpose of collecting and remitting taxes.

  HB 1628 Morrison, Geanie(R)

Relating to the authority of coastal counties to adopt  
certain rules for island parks, beach parks, and public

beaches.

**Companions:** SB 665 Kolkhorst, Lois(R) (Identical)  
4- 1-19 S Meeting set for 2:00 P.M. OR ADJ.,  
E1.012, Senate Water and Rural Affairs

**Remarks:** WLJ - CS - includes a specification that the rules the applicable commissioners courts may adopt under the bill be consistent with Natural Resources Code provisions relating to dunes and the use and maintenance of public beaches and consistent with the rules adopted under those provisions.

WLJ - Permits Coastal County Commissioners Court with a beach wholly or partly operated by the county as a park to adopt rules on camping, access, litter and waste disposal on parks and beaches. Creates a Class C Misdemeanor for violating an ordinance.

  HB 1653 White, James(R)

Relating to certain criminal justice reforms, including measures related to reentry and reintegration of state jail felony defendants and pretrial intervention programs that provide an alternative to incarceration.

**Remarks:** JBD - HCS - No reporting to OCA. Instead, CJD must create pretrial diversion database. Counties receiving grants for pretrial diversion must report data. Creates separate funding line for probation depts supervising pretrial diversion participants.

MGV - Authorizes the community justice assistance division to provide to a department, municipality, or county operating a pretrial intervention program per capita funding that is a per diem amount for each participating felony defendant. For grants awarded for providing pretrial intervention programs, stipulates the division prioritize departments that serve counties that establish pretrial intervention programs for state jail felony defendants; place eligible defendants into pretrial intervention programs as soon as practicable after each defendant's arrest; or reduce and minimize the avg amount of time defendants spend confined pending trial or placement into a pretrial program. Establishes reporting requirements for grant recipients and the division.

This is a response to USSC case South Dakota v Wayfair. Would combine all local sales taxes into one rate for certain sellers to remit the combined rate for internet sales.

**Remarks:** WLJ - CS - adds in a pole component. Would allow electric cooperatives to construct, operate and maintain broadband cables.

  **SB 20** Huffman, Joan(R) Relating to the prosecution of, penalties for, and other consequences of prostitution, trafficking of persons, and related criminal offenses, the admissibility of evidence.

**Remarks:** JBD - CS - changes do not impact county operations. JBD - Mandates participation in prostitution prevention programs for certain defendants if the county has a program. If the county does have a program, must provide participants with notice of new right to obtain an order of nondisclosure.

Zerwas, John(R) Relating to making supplemental appropriations and reductions in appropriations and prescribing limitations regarding appropriations.

**Remarks:** WLJ - FA - From TDEM funds, \$30m for Harris County to purchase equipment to remove sediment. Reduces TRIP by 12,727,775 allocates those funds to Hurricane affected colleges.

WLJ - CS - \$3b for Harvey expenses; \$1.7b in GR; \$4.3b from the ESF.

\$2.1b Medicaid; \$100 for SB 10; \$300m state mental hospitals; \$542 for TRS; \$211 Tomorrow Fund; \$160m Correctional managed care; \$100 Governors disaster fund.

Relating to the composition of the governing bodies and the consultation policies of local mental health authorities with respect to sheriffs, their representatives, and local law enforcement agencies.

**Remarks:** WLJ - FA - Clarifies a Sheriff can be a voting member of the LMHA. WLJ- CS - Non substantive

WLJ - Requires an LMHA to have a Sheriff on the board.

  SB 702 Bettencourt, Paul(R)

Relating to the authorization and reporting of expenditures for lobbying activities by certain political subdivisions and other public entities.

3-19-19 H Introduced and referred to committee on House State Affairs

**Remarks:** JBD - SFA - Bill does not apply to government officer or employee who is requested to appear by a legislator so long as person does not take a position for or against legislation.

MGV - Permits a political subdivision or entity to spend money to directly or indirectly influence or attempt to influence the outcome of any legislation pending before the legislature only if expenditure is authorized by a majority of the governing body in an open meeting of governing body. Requires the political subdivision or entity to report to TX Ethics Commission and publish on the subdivision's website amount of money authorized, name of any person required to register, and copy of contract for services, amount of public money spent for membership fees and dues of any nonprofit state association or organization. Requires Ethics Commission to create a public database concerning such reports. If political subdivision does not comply, entitles an interest party to appropriate injunctive relief to prevent further activity in violation. Applicable to political subdivisions, regional mobility authority, transit authority, regional tollway authority, special purpose district, public institution of higher education, community college district, publicly owned utility, and river authority.

**Remarks:** SCS - nonsubstantive change JBD - Repeals the El Paso-only bracket on the provisions permitting counties to create ethics commission. So all counties will be permitted to create county ethics commissions.

VRS - Transfers the authority to merge with another power generation company from the owner of an electric generation facility to a power generation company. Allows this transaction to occur in a power region open to customer choice. Requires that a power generation company get the approval of the utilities commission before closing if the transaction would give the company over 10% ownership or control over the installed generation capacity of the region.
