GENERAL DISCUSSION

5. AI-47993 Sale of Westminster Square, Commissioner, Precinct 3.

Commissioner Hale said the County was approached by Rodger Luttrell, Benton Luttrell Real Estate, representing a client on a potential sale of Westminster Square. This is a piece of property that Collin County obtained when

the town of Westminster disincorporated. The Commissioner said the property has been sitting stagnant and would like for the Court to discuss this offer.

Mr. Luttrell said John Myers and Claud Webb are part of the ownership group who have purchased the three buildings across the street from the Westminster Square. One of the problems for the merchants in that area is the accessibility to parking. The intent is to purchase the Westminster Square and allow the current merchants to use it equally. Commissioner Webb asked if the property is currently available. Mr. Luttrell said it is available, but on weekends it is first come first served, and many times the merchants don't have adequate parking for their businesses. Judge Hill said over the years there have been large semi-trucks and groups of motorcycles parked there. The County has maintained the parking lot, but there have never been any rules on who can park there. The Judge said the Commissioners Court could sell the property if it is deemed to be surplus. The County could get an estimate on the appraised value and accept bids from the public to buy the property. Commissioner Hale said there is no reason to keep the property and made a motion to have an appraisal done for value. Commissioner Webb said he may need to look into possibly needing another subcampus long-term and this property is in a perfect area. Bill Bilyeu, County Administrator, said the size of this lot is probably not big enough to support County operations. (Time: 1:39 p.m.)
