Equipment to facilitate an additional set up crew is being rented. The last 19 months we have spent \$69,787.00 which is 35.24 % of a new machine. The new machine will pay for itself within a 3 year period at that rate. Any increase in rental costs would shorten that timeframe.

We currently have 3 set up crews and only have 2 rollers for their operations. Due to the situation, equipment is being rented to accommodate the third crew. The increased and increasing amount of commuter and heavy truck traffic, is and will continue to, result in road damage. As the number and miles of roads to upgrade to asphalt is reduced, Public Works has modified our organizing, transitioning those crews into reconstruction by moving FDR operations, setting up roads behind the reclaimer on entire road projects. This compactor will be used by a crew following the FDR machine. The FDR machine and crew will grind and make drivable as much road as they can per day, until they complete the grinding of the entire road. They then move to the next road. A setup crew then moves in to setup the road and get it ready for the driving surface. The FDR machine will stay several roads/miles ahead of the setup crew.

Public Works currently has a CAT RM-500 reclaimer used for full depth reclamation, stabilization and mixing projects involving the whole road. Public Works rented a reclaimer last season to perform cutout repairs, so as not to affect the entire FDR operation. The current rental rate of the machine is \$14,500.00 mo.

Purchase 1, Bomag MPH360 reclaimer/mixer. This unit will enable crews to perform large cutout repairs that do not involve the entire road length, increasing the repairs made each season. This machine will also be used for complete road projects that cannot accommodate the larger RM-500 machine due to narrow right-of-way or other factors limiting the area available to work in. Public Works did not purchase the Asphalt Zipper previously approved in 2020 for \$206,750.00, after attending a demo of the Bomag reclaimer and subsequent rental of the same model. Public Works requests these funds be applied towards the purchase the Bomag reclaimer as this machine better fits the needs of the department. Public Works currently has 10 electronic message boards. Utilization of the message boards includes but is not limited to, road construction projects, culvert replacements, changes in traffic patterns, delay advisories, road surface damage, flooded roads, closed roads due to weather events, bridge damage and other occasions that present issues that will affect traffic. We have several road projects underway at the same time, but lack sufficient message boards to adequately keep the public informed. At any given time, Public Works has 10-20 active projects of varying scope and we must determine which projects will receive message boards and which projects will not, as some projects require multiple message boards to adequately inform the driving public.

Public Works request to purchase 2 additional electronic message boards with cellular and radar capabilities and steel security cages on both boxes. They will be used to provide residents with advance notice and information regarding roadwork or other events that will affect traffic. With the increase in population and thus traffic, the existing condition and improvement of the County's infrastructure is critical. Construction and reconstruction projects will be increasing greatly in number, size, and complexity. The message boards will be placed 1-2 weeks prior to the beginning of scheduled projects and remain for the duration of each project. In emergency situations, they will be placed as soon as possible to display public information or directions and be removed when the event is over.

#### Request Title Epidemiologist

### NOT Included in the FY 2021 Recommended Budget Priority #

Our community depends on our health department's epidemiology staff members to investigate and mitigate 80+ diseases that have been classified by Texas state law as "Notifiable Conditions." These infectious diseases are transmitted by air, water, blood, food, or animals. Health departments must investigate disease reports to determine how the patient became ill, and provide recommendations and guidance to health care providers, community leaders, and the public. Each year, there are outbreaks of diseases such as Salmonella, Multi-Drug (MDR) and Extensively Drug Resistant (XDR) organisms ("Super Bugs"), Varicella ("Chicken Pox"), Shiga-toxin E.coli, to name a few. School districts, long term care facilities, global/multi-billion dollar corporations, small business owners, daycares, and other stakeholders lean heavily on the guidance provided by our public health professionals to keep others from becoming ill. The Epidemiology Communication Demands reflect the rising push to exchange information as a result of the volume and complexity of their cases. In FY2019, our department requested 3 Epidemiologists and was approved for 1 position, yet the need remains for more Epidemiologists. The benchmark for infectious disease control staffing according to the Council of State and Territorial Epidemiologists (CSTE) is 1 Epidemiologist per 100,000 residents and our team consists of 1 Chief Epidemiologists and 3 Epidemiologists, which is roughly half of the recommended staffing level. In 2015 there were 8 outbreaks investigated (164 affected individuals), and 2018, 28 outbreaks investigated (806 affected individuals). 2019 ended with a record-setting number of outbreaks investigated (64) and affected individuals (4753). The county's sustained population growth, proximity to an international airport, and lower than optimal vaccination rates directly contribute to the expansive workload of the Epidemiologists. Also, we recognize that it is impossible to predict when a public health crisis such as the novel coronavirus (COVID

Job Duties of New Position: Individuals would be trained in investigating all notifiable conditions and perform disease surveillance throughout the county. Epidemiologists receive and analyze disease reports submitted by the public, labs, hospitals, primary care physicians, and other state and federal health agencies. They collect data and specimens from patients, monitor patients exposed to disease for symptoms, provide education and guidance to physicians and individuals regarding infectious diseases. Epidemiologists are required to report on data collected to local and state agencies as well as collate date for reports. As needed, Epidemiologists may give presentations to the public, schools, and healthcare providers on infectious diseases and/or how to prevent the spread of disease. The Epidemiologist is expected to support the team's rotating on cal schedule to respond to public health emergencies 24/7/365.

As the health department responds to public health issues on a larger scale, we need the corresponding capacity to handle the volume of incoming and outgoing phone calls. Recent disease outbreaks, large contact investigations, and other events impacting our community such as Hurricane Harvey and the 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID19) have created a growing need for a call center that can be activated at a moment's notice. We have used volunteers from our Medical Reserve Corps for surge capacity and provide them specialized training on a regular basis. However, even with the necessary staffing to assist us, we have needed to borrow phone equipment from exam rooms and IT and piece together a call center for the volunteers and our staff members to use away from their private work areas. Learning from those experiences, we submit this request as a priority for our department to establish a permanent solution for expanding our call volume capacity.

The funds will be used to purchase the necessary equipment for a call center to be housed at the health department including cables, phones, switch, and maintenance costs.

In FY2017, the county approved a second physician (Dr. Arifa Nishat) to provide necessary clinical support to our patients. At the end of FY2019, our tenured physician, Dr. Muriel Marshall retired and Dr. Sadia Siddiqui filled the position. In contrast to prior years, and with the arrival of Dr. Siddiqui, we now have three clinicians who spend half or more of their work hours in the Employee Health Clinic to provide a wide range of services for our employees. Even though we have increased our number of providers working in the Employee Health Clinic and our capacity is expected to continue to increase over time, we only have one Employee Health Nurse. This is the first request in over 20 years to add nursing staff to the Employee Health Clinic. The combined expertise of Dr. Siddiqui and Dr. Nishat as family practice physicians has generated more consultations for symptom relief, more intensive office visits that require follow up care, and filling of medications beyond what was offered in previous years. These activities require considerable communication between the physician/physician's assistant, the nurse, and the patient as well as other providers offices and pharmacies. Additionally, the nurse's documentation before, during, and after the patient's visit is essential for the provider to perform their duties. In order to support our providers as they strive to evaluate and treat the maximum number of patients, an additional nurse would ensure patient care does not suffer due to insufficient nurse staffing.

Escorts patients and obtains the required information for clinic visit. Performs lab work. Performs professional nursing work in providing clinical health/immunization care to County employees, certain State of Texas employees, and their eligible dependents. Responds to patients in crisis. Inventory and stocking of clinic supplies. Assists with CPR training of County employees. Assists with triaging STD patients. Assists with referrals to and from outside healthcare providers. Assists with Functional Physical Capacity Assessment testing for prospective employees. Assists with annual Wellness visits. Assists with flu outreach clinics conducted at several locations to provide flu vaccinations to county employees.
