### Benefits to County and Citizens

The COVID-2019 CoAg grant has been provided by DSHS through the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) as part of the Coronavirus 2019 response. The COVID-2019 grant focuses on surveillance, laboratory testing, and reporting activities as well as developing a Community Intervention Implementation Plan. These required activities are meant to enhance public health capacity to identify cases, report case data, identify contacts, analyze data, perform surveillance, and conduct disease mitigation activities in our county.

The Funds for this grant are used for personnel, fringe, and computer/phone related costs for essential personnel. Additionally, expenditures for supplies for personal protective equipment (PPE) and testing of specimens is included. Necessary training and travel associated with grant activities have been budgeted.

COVID-2019 activities follow the guidance of the CDC's capabilities related to this public health event:
