## COVID-19 Grant Community Intervention Implementation Plan

Collin County will work to reduce community spread of COVID-19 through the following steps:

- 1. Conduct COVID-19 case and/or outbreak surveillance and disease mitigation.
  - a. Provide education regarding mitigation actions such as isolation, quarantine, and non-pharmaceutical interventions to stop disease transmission.
  - b. Manage and transfer data as appropriate.
- 2. Work closely with external stakeholders to educate them on disease mitigation and to identify and resolve problems surrounding the COVID-19 response. Stakeholders include but are not limited to:
  - a. Texas Department of State Health Services
  - b. Regulatory agencies
  - c. Regional government agencies
  - d. Healthcare coalition partners
  - e. City governments
  - f. Hospitals
  - g. Independent school districts and private schools
  - h. Long-term care facilities
- 3. Identify incident responders and work to improve their health and safety by coordinating efforts to improve access to PPE and provide education.
- 4. Work closely with partners that serve vulnerable populations to improve outcomes for these populations.
- 5. Conduct public education regarding non-pharmaceutical interventions and, once available, pharmaceutical interventions.
- 6. Prepare both Collin County and its stakeholders for vaccine distribution to critical infrastructure and vulnerable populations once a vaccine is available.
