Commissioner Webb led the Invocation.

Judge Hill called to order the meeting of the <u>Collin County Commissioners Court</u> at 1:30 p.m. and recessed the meeting at 1:34 p.m. for Executive Session. The meeting was reconvened at 1:39 p.m., recessed at 1:40 p.m., and reconvened again at 1:40 p.m. The meeting was adjourned at 2:00 p.m.

President Hill called to order the meeting of the <u>Collin County Health Care Foundation</u> at 1:40 p.m. and adjourned the meeting at 1:40 p.m.

COMMISSIONERS COURT BUSINESS:

1. Public Comments.

Carrolyn Moebius, Murphy, said she wanted to address the proposed wastewater treatment plant in the ETJ (Extra-Territorial Jurisdiction) of Parker, Texas. Ms. Moebius referred to a court order passed in September 2020 saying the action of one property owner should not adversely affect the rights of another property owner, which is a concern with this plant in the Murphy and Parker areas. Ms. Moebius asked the Court to add this as an agenda item and vote for a resolution.

Tracy Homfeld, Engineering, said ETJs are governed by the cities they fall into and are required to obtain permits from TCEQ (Texas Commission on Environmental Quality). The County would only be involved if flood plains in the area need to be reviewed.

Judy Dishong, Plano, said she wants reports on the number of Collin County citizens vaccinated and dying. Ms. Dishong also said public speakers are often ignored, told to sit down, and contradicted by Judge Hill.

Miguel Palacios, Plano, read an article to the Court and said Governor Abbott is following former President Trump's orders to complete the election audit.

Joshua Murray, Lavon, said he was concerned about item number 51127 on the agenda. Mr. Murray said the Court does not take additional support staff needed or increased response times into consideration when approving MUD (Municipal Utility District) items and wants the Court to establish a committee for MUD decisions.

Commissioner Hale said taxpayers pay additional taxes into the MUD and those taxes go to the County to pay for extra officers and support. The Collin County Sheriff also charges a fee on top of the existing taxes to contract with a MUD.

Commissioner Webb said the MUD structure was created by the State Legislature and the County does not have much of a say in the creation of MUD areas. Commissioner Webb also said the Court is doing what they can to ensure the safety of citizens who live in MUDs. (Time: 2:00 p.m.)
