Vaccine Approval Process

- 1. The vaccine manufacturer requests to place their vaccine on the market and begin administering it to patients.
- 2. FDA's Vaccines and Related Biological Products Advisory Committee makes a recommendation on whether the vaccine should be approved or denied based on efficacy and safety data.
- 3. The **FDA** approves or denies the vaccine.
 - a. This may be full approval or Emergency Use Authorization (EUA).
- 4. CDC's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) makes medical recommendations on the details of vaccine administration (number of doses, time between doses, who should receive the vaccine, precautions, contraindications).
- 5. The **CDC Director** issues the final approval for the vaccine and the details of how it should be administered.

One of the most comprehensive sites to search for a vaccine is the *Center for Disease Control and Prevention* (CDC) **Vaccines.gov** site.

This page has a zip code look-up to set for a 25 or 50-miles radius, and you can search by vaccine brand (*Moderna* for ages 18+), *Pfizer-BioTech* (ages 12 and up), and *Johnson* & *Johnson* (Ages 18 and up). Links to pharmacy chains, grocery store pharmacies, private doctor's offices, and clinics that tie into the providers' appointment availability and scheduling websites.

Texas Public Health Vaccine Scheduler

The **Texas Public Health Vaccine Scheduler** (TPHVS) is a new way to sign up for the COVID-19 vaccine where you register, create and account with the Department of State Health Services. You will be notified by email or text when and where to get the vaccine. If there's not a public health clinic near you, you will be directed to other places to get your vaccine.




