The intent of this project is to reduce illegal dumping. Collin County Criminal Investigation Unit (CIU) will take lead in making sure this problem with illegal dumping is done. The CIU is seeking to install fifteen (15) Browning Patriot Game Cameras, along with one (1) Milwaukee/Compact Drill, Driver Kit with Charger and Case for Game Camera, one (1) Nikon D850 DSLR Camera, one (1) ATN NVM14-4 Night Vision Monocular with Goggle Kit (for convert night operations of illegal activities), one (1) ATN Thermal BINOX/Thermal Binocular and one (1) multirae systems mulirae pro/monitor sensor to be requested with the grant funding and distributed throughout various places in Collin County and for use to detect what is found to be hazard and/or toxic substance. These tools will heighten CIU's ability to monitor and observe known illegal dumping locations. The cameras will increase the ability to monitor, investigate, prosecute, and reduce the amount of illegal activity occurring in Collin County.

Collin County has grown rapidly to an estimated 1,064,465 as stated in the U.S. Census Bureau. With that being said, Collin County Sheriff's Office/Criminal Investigation Unit covers 841 square feet miles and an estimated service population of over 80,000 citizens across the county's unincorporated areas (half of which are rural and farmlands), and five municipalities without police departments.

A lot of the illegal dumping is in these areas and has become a serious problem. When not addressed, illegal dumpsites attract additional dumping. Illegal dumping poses environmental and health risk, safety problems and

negatively impacts economic growth. Plus it is a crime. The rural areas have chronic illegal dumping sites, where everything from trash bags to building waste and refrigerators to tires are discarded. These items are dumped along roadsides, ditches and fields. The environment suffers because toxic pollutants are released into streams and can harm wildlife. Trash not only is unsightly and unattractive but also harbors rodents and becomes breeding grounds for insects. Businesses within the rural area and surroundings suffer because extra trash pickups can cost several hundred of dollars each month. Farmers also suffer because fields and crops are destroyed; livestock is disturbed or die all because of the illegal dumping and what can be found in the garbage. Our main concern will be those County roads and property that you would think no one travels but has been highly used to illegally dump trash, which causes a public health and safety concern as well as an issue. From October of 2021 to present, some of these sites have costs the county and its residents more than \$16,000 to dump over 85,000 pounds at the landfill (from 121 different locations) hazardous wastes (which does not include sites checked totaling 365).

The CIU is seeking to install fifteen Browning Patriot Game Cameras, along with one (1) Milwaukee/Compact Drill, Driver Kit with Charger and Case for Game Camera, one (1) Nikon D850 DSLR Camera, one (1) ATN NVM14-4 Night Vision Monocular with Goggle Kit (for convert night operations of illegal activities), one (1) ATN Thermal BINOX/Thermal Binocular and one (1) multirae systems mulirae pro/monitor sensor to be requested with the grant funding and placed in the major sites where illegal dumping is occurring consistently. These cameras will heighten CIU's ability to monitor and observe known illegal dumping locations. The cameras will also increase the ability to monitor, investigate, prosecute, and reduce the amount of illegal activity occurring in Collin County. The thermal binoculars and the sensors to determine hazardous and/or toxic substances will also be of much need assistance to us when monitoring and investigating.

Camera surveillance will prove to be extremely effective in diminishing the incidents of illegal dumping. The cameras that will be purchased will allow us to remotely observe illegal dumpers per day. These cameras (state of the art) capable of withstanding temperatures and capturing images at night can be discreetly placed at known dumping sites in order to bring down the number of illegal litterers.

Collin County will also inform the community of the costs and effects of illegal dumping by standard outreach tools such as the following but not limited to brochures, pamphlets, direct mail and presentations if requested or when investigating, and/or when processing citations/fines. It is anticipated that judges will order those found guilty to repay expenses. These funds will be used to continue the program as long as possible.

A reduction in repeat/continued illegal dumping are anticipated outcomes. Measurement and reporting will be by the following but not limited to evidence/proof from cameras, tracking complaints, tracking enforcement actions/fines given to illegal dumpers (collected number of offenders identified), warrants served, cases prosecuted and any outreach that might be requested or needed as well as quarterly and end of the year reports to NCTCOG and TCEQ.

Implementing this program will reduce illegal dumping by 80%. Collin County will undoubtedly benefit from this program, as we are focused on increasing the mission which is to protect and enhance the quality of life, health and safety and welfare of our residents as well as ensuring the future health and safety of our county which will show a great impact for all.
