An order of the Commissioners Court approving the filing of the March 28, 2022 minutes.

On Monday, March 28, 2022, the Commissioners Court of Collin County, Texas, met in Regular Session in the Commissioners Courtroom, Jack Hatchell Collin County Administration Building, 4th Floor, 2300 Bloomdale Road, City of McKinney, Texas, with the following members present, and participating, to wit:

Judge Chris Hill Commissioner Susan Fletcher, Precinct 1 Commissioner Cheryl Williams, Precinct 2 Commissioner Darrell Hale, Precinct 3 Commissioner Duncan Webb, Precinct 4

Commissioner Webb led the Invocation. Judge Hill led the Pledge of Allegiance. Commissioner Hale led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Texas Flag.

Judge Hill called to order the meeting of the <u>Collin County Commissioners Court</u> at 1:30 p.m. and recessed the meeting at 1:33 p.m. The meeting reconvened at 2:26 p.m. and adjourned at 2:38 p.m.

President Hill called to order the meeting of the <u>Collin County Health Care Foundation</u> at 2:38 p.m. and adjourned the meeting at 2:39 p.m.

COMMISSIONERS COURT BUSINESS:

Public Comments.

Janet Gagnon, McKinney, gave the Court visual aids to discuss the proposed bypasses for US-380. TxDOT (Texas Department of Transportation) held a meeting on March 22nd discussing the options Ms. Gagnon presented to the Court. Ms. Gagnon asked the Court to make a resolution opposing section C and D in the ETJ (Extra Territorial Jurisdiction) of McKinney. These portions are not appropriate for the area, and Spur 399, which is directly south of US-380, can handle the traffic. Alternatively, Ms. Gagnon asked the Court to propose enlarging US-380 from US-75 to FM 1827 if Spur 399 is not an option. US-380 is currently expanding between FM 1827 and New Hope so this option would add more lanes to US-380 rather than cutting through homes and farms. Ms. Gagnon said this Court had a previous resolution supporting widening US-380 from Prosper to Farmersville, but TxDOT publicly denied this resolution during their meeting on March 22nd. Ms. Gagnon said a body has stood up against TxDOT before and won citing the city of Prosper's rejection of a TxDOT bypass within their city limits.

Petra Anzualda, McKinney, gave the Court a printout to review. She asked the Court about the status of Ms. Bermudez's engineer's plan for the 100 year flood and if the plan being revised, finalized, or put into action. She also asked about the deadline for the plan and how long it will take to complete. Ms. Anzualda said she and her husband have spoken before the Court since December 2021 to ask for help with the flooding issue. The flooding issue started in December 2020, and the timeline she gave to the Court details what has happened since then. Ms. Anzualda said Ms. Bermudez has shown blatant disregard for rules and her neighbors, and they need a deadline for rules to be enforced.

Robert Anzualda, McKinney, said he would like the Court to use his three minutes to review the timeline from his wife. Mr. Anzualda said he expects an email with the deadline for implementation and completion of the plan that will be enforced.

Scott Morrissey, McKinney, said he has videos for the Court to review. Judge Hill said there is not enough time or capacity for visual aids at this time. Mr. Morrissey said there was a one-day rain event that flooded the roads, and the water now goes over the culverts and is washing out neighbors' driveways. The wall is still blocking the water at the end, and Mr. Morrissey would like it removed as soon as possible. Mr. Morrissey said he is not sure what else they can do to ask for help after sending pictures and speaking in Court, but he is willing to do whatever it takes to get the issue resolved. The engineering firm cannot engineer around a stone wall and two ten-foot fences. The weekend before last, the neighbor had 15 concrete trucks pour concrete on her property, further barricading it from water. Mr. Morrissey said this

will flood more property. Commissioner Hale asked Mr. Morrissey and Mr. Anzualda to meet him after Court.

Joshua Murray, Lavon, referred to the meeting on February 21, 2022, where Judge Hill presented Tammy Mahan and the Court with a check for \$1.5 million for Lifepath. Mr. Murray asked the Court to confirm the funds have been appropriated to Lifepath and, if not, when they will be appropriated. Mr. Murray said the mission of this body is to deliver services for the people of Collin County. This mission is destined to fail without adequate staff to execute the mission. The Sheriff's Office has a need for additional personnel to support the jail. The increase in entry-level Detention Officer pay has resulted in an increase in experienced applicants who may eventually become Deputy Sheriffs. Mr. Murray said the decision to increase the pay would not have happened without last minute interjections by Commissioner Williams and collaboration with Commissioners Webb and Fletcher.

During the last budget session, Bruce Sherbet, Elections, said it has been a decade since they received authorization for more personnel. Also, over the last year, several departments have been unable to retain personnel. Mr. Murray asked the Court to have all department heads come to Court prior to July to give a two-year and five-year plan that will address the staffing needed and what they will do to fill the spots.
