- 1.3 Collin County is always conscious and extremely appreciative of your time and effort in preparing your Submittal.
- 1.4 Collin County exclusively uses ionWave Technologies, Inc. (Collin County eBid) for the notification and dissemination of all solicitations. The receipt of solicitations through any other company may result in your receipt of incomplete specifications and/or addenda which could ultimately render your bid non-compliant. Collin County accepts no responsibility for the receipt and/or notification of solicitations through any other company.
- 1.5 A bid may not be withdrawn or canceled by the bidder prior to the ninety-first (91st) day following public opening of Submittals and only prior to award.
- 1.6 It is understood that Collin County, Texas reserves the right to accept or reject any and/or all Bids for any or all products and/or services covered in an Invitation For Bid (IFB), and to waive informalities or defects in Submittals or to accept such Submittals as it shall deem to be in the best interest of Collin County.
- 1.7 All IFBs submitted in hard copy paper form shall be submitted in a sealed envelope, plainly marked on the outside with the IFB number and name. A hard copy paper form Submittal shall be manually signed in ink by a person having the authority to bind the firm in a contract. Submittals shall be mailed or hand delivered to the Collin County Purchasing Department.
- 1.8 No oral, telegraphic or telephonic Submittals will be accepted. IFBs may be submitted in electronic format via Collin County eBid.
- 1.9 All IFBs submitted electronically via Collin County eBid shall remain locked until official date and time of opening as stated in the Special Terms and Conditions of the IFB.
- 1.10 Time/date stamp clock in Collin County Purchasing Department shall be the official time of receipt for all IFBs submitted in hard copy paper form. - 1.12 Collin County is by statute exempt from the State Sales Tax and Federal Excise Tax; therefore, the prices submitted shall not include taxes.

- 1.13 Any interpretations, corrections and/or changes to an IFB, and related Specifications or extensions to the opening/receipt date will be made by addenda to the respective document by the Collin County Purchasing Department. Questions and/or clarification requests must be submitted no later than the date specified in the solicitation. Those received at a later date may not be addressed prior to the public opening. - 1.21 Public Information Act: Collin County is governed by the Texas Public Information Act, Chapter 552 of the Texas Government Code. All information submitted by prospective Bidders during the bidding process is subject to release under the Act.
- 1.22 The Bidder shall comply with Commissioners Court Order No. 2004-167-03-11, County Logo Policy.
- 1.23 Interlocal Agreement: Successful Bidder agrees to extend prices and terms to all entities that has entered into or will enter into joint purchasing interlocal cooperation agreements with Collin County. Delivery to governmental entities located within Collin County will be at no additional charge or as otherwise provided for in the award

document. Delivery charges, if any, for governmental entities located outside of Collin County shall be negotiated between the Vendor and each governmental entity.

1.24 Bid Openings: All bids submitted will be read at the county's regularly scheduled bid opening for the designated project. However, the reading of a bid at bid opening should be not construed as a comment on the responsiveness of such bid or as any indication that the county accepts such bid as responsive.

The county will make a determination as to the responsiveness of bids submitted based upon compliance with all applicable laws, Collin County Purchasing Guidelines, and project documents, including but not limited to the project specifications and contract documents. The county will notify the successful Bidder upon award of the contract and, according to state law; all bids received will be available for inspection at that time.

1.25 Bidder shall comply with all local, state and federal employment and discrimination laws and shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, age, national origin or any other class protected by law.

2.0 TERMS OF CONTRACT

- 2.1 A bid, when properly accepted by Collin County, shall constitute a contract equally binding between the Vendor/Contractor/Provider and Collin County. No different or additional terms will become part of this contract with the exception of a Change Order.
- 2.2 No oral statement of any person shall modify or otherwise change, or affect the terms, conditions or specifications stated in the resulting contract. All Amendments and/or Change Orders to the contract will be made in writing by Collin County Purchasing Agent.
- 2.3 No public official shall have interest in the contract, in accordance with Vernon's Texas Codes Annotated, Local Government Code Title 5, Subtitle C, Chapter 171.
- 2.4 The Vendor/Contractor/Provider shall comply with Commissioners' Court Order No. 96-680-10-28, Establishment of Guidelines & Restrictions Regarding the Acceptance of Gifts by County Officials & County Employees.
- 2.5 Design, strength, quality of materials and workmanship must conform to the highest standards of manufacturing and engineering practice.
- 2.6 Bids must comply with all federal, state, county and local laws concerning the type(s) of product(s)/service(s)/equipment/project(s) contracted for, and the fulfillment of all ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) requirements.
- 2.7 All products must be new and unused, unless otherwise specified, in first-class condition and of current manufacture. Obsolete products, including products or any parts not compatible with existing hardware/software configurations will not be accepted.
- 2.8 Vendor/Contractor/Provider shall provide any and all notices as may be required under the Drug-Free Work Place Act of 1988, 28 CFR Part 67, Subpart F, to its employees and all sub-contractors to insure that Collin County maintains a drug-free work place.
- Vendor/Contractor/Provider shall defend, indemnify and save harmless Collin County and all its officers, agents and employees and all entities, their officers, agents and employees who are participating in this contract from all suits, claims, actions, damages (including personal injury and or property damages), or demands of any character, name and description, (including attorneys' fees, expenses and other defense costs of any nature) brought for or on account of any injuries or damages received or sustained by any person, persons, or property on account of Vendor/Contractor/Provider's breach of the contract arising from an award, and/or any negligent act, error, omission or fault of the Vendor/Contractor/Provider, or of any agent, employee, subcontractor or supplier of Vendor/Contractor/Provider in the execution of, or performance under, any contract which may result from an award. Vendor/Contractor/Provider shall pay in full any judgment with costs, including attorneys' fees and expenses which are rendered against Collin County and/or participating entities arising out of such breach, act, error, omission and/or fault.
- 2.10 Expenses for Enforcement. In the event either Party hereto is required to employ an attorney to enforce the provisions of this Agreement or is required to commence legal proceedings to enforce the provisions hereof, the prevailing Party shall be entitled to recover from the other, reasonable attorney's fees and court costs incurred in connection with such enforcement, including collection.
- 2.11 If a contract, resulting from a Collin County IFB is for the execution of a public work, the following shall apply:
 - 2.11.1 In accordance with V.T.C.A. 2253.021, a governmental agency that makes a public work contract with a prime contractor shall require the contractor, before beginning work, to execute to the governmental entity a Payment Bond if the contract is in excess of \$25,000.00. Such bond shall

be in the amount of the contract payable to the governmental entity and must be executed by a corporate surety in accordance with Section 1, Chapter 87, Acts of the 56th Legislature, Regular Session, 1959 (Article 7.19-1 Vernon's Texas Insurance Code).

- 2.11.2 In accordance with V.T.C.A. 2253.021, a governmental agency that makes a public work contract with a prime contractor shall require the contractor, before beginning work, to execute to the governmental entity a Performance Bond if the contract is in excess of \$100,000.00. Such bond shall be in the amount of the contract payable to the governmental entity and must be executed by a corporate surety in accordance with Section 1, Chapter 87, Acts of the 56th Legislature, Regular Session, 1959 (Article 7.19-1 Vernon's Texas Insurance Code).
- 2.12 Purchase Order(s) shall be generated by Collin County to the vendor. Collin County will not be responsible for any orders placed/delivered without a valid purchase order number.
- 2.13 The contract shall remain in effect until any of the following occurs: delivery of product(s) and/or completion and acceptance by Collin County of product(s) and/or service(s), contract expires or is terminated by either party with thirty (30) days written notice prior to cancellation and notice must state therein the reasons for such cancellation. Collin County reserves the right to terminate the contract immediately in the event the Vendor/Contractor/Provider fails to meet delivery or completion schedules, or otherwise perform in accordance with the specifications. Breach of contract or default authorizes the County to purchase elsewhere and charge the full increase in cost and handling to the defaulting Vendor/Contractor/Provider.
- 2.14 Collin County Purchasing Department shall serve as Contract Administrator or shall supervise agents designated by Collin County.
- 2.15 All delivery and freight charges (FOB Inside delivery at Collin County designated locations) are to be included as part of the bid price. All components required to render the item complete, installed and operational shall be included in the total bid price. Collin County will pay no additional freight/delivery/installation/setup fees.
- 2.16 Vendor/Contractor/Provider shall notify the Purchasing Department immediately if delivery/completion schedule cannot be met. If delay is foreseen, the Vendor/Contractor/Provider shall give written notice to the Purchasing Agent. The County has the right to extend delivery/completion time if reason appears valid.
- 2.17 The title and risk of loss of the product(s) shall not pass to Collin County until Collin County actually receives and takes possession of the product(s) at the point or points of delivery. Collin County shall generate a purchase order(s) to the Vendor/Contractor/Provider and the purchase order number must appear on all itemized invoices.
- 2.18 Invoices shall be mailed directly to the Collin County Auditor's Office, 2300 Bloomdale Road, Suite 3100, McKinney, Texas 75071. All invoices shall show:
 - 2.18.1 Collin County Purchase Order Number;
 - 2.18.2 Vendor's/Contractor's/Provider's Name, Address and Tax Identification Number;
 - 2.18.3 Detailed breakdown of all charges for the product(s) and/or service(s) including applicable time frames.
- 2.19 Payment will be made in accordance with V.T.C.A., Government Code, Title 10, Subtitle F, Chapter 2251.
- 2.20 All warranties shall be stated as required in the Uniform Commercial Code.
- 2.21 The Vendor/Contractor/Provider and Collin County agree that both parties have all rights, duties, and remedies available as stated in the Uniform Commercial Code.

- 2.22 The Vendor/Contractor/Provider agree to protect Collin County from any claims involving infringements of patents and/or copyrights.
- 2.23 The contract will be governed by the laws of the State of Texas. Should any portion of the contract be in conflict with the laws of the State of Texas, the State laws shall invalidate only that portion. The remaining portion of the contract shall remain in effect. The contract is performable in Collin County, Texas.
- 2.24 The Vendor/Contractor/Provider shall not sell, assign, transfer or convey the contract, in whole or in part, without the prior written approval from Collin County.
- 2.25 The apparent silence of any part of the specification as to any detail or to the apparent omission from it of a detailed description concerning any point, shall be regarded as meaning that only the best commercial practices are to prevail. All interpretations of the specification shall be made on the basis of this statement.
- 2.26 Vendor/Contractor/Provider shall not fraudulently advertise, publish or otherwise make reference to the existence of a contract between Collin County and Vendor/Contractor/Provider for purposes of solicitation. As exception, Vendor/Contractor/Provider may refer to Collin County as an evaluating reference for purposes of establishing a contract with other entities.
- 2.27 The Vendor/Contractor/Provider understands. acknowledges that if the and agrees Vendor/Contractor/Provider subcontracts with a third party for services and/or material, the primary Vendor/Contractor/Provider (awardee) accepts responsibility for full and prompt payment to the third party. Any dispute between the primary Vendor/Contractor/Provider and the third party, including any payment dispute, will be promptly remedied by the primary vendor. Failure to promptly render a remedy or to make prompt payment to the third party (subcontractor) may result in the withholding of funds from the primary Vendor/Contractor/Provider by Collin County for any payments owed to the third party.
- 2.28 Vendor/Contractor/Provider shall provide Collin County with diagnostic access tools at no additional cost to Collin County, for all Electrical and Mechanical systems, components, etc., procured through this contract.
- 2.29 Criminal History Background Check: If required, ALL individuals may be subject to a criminal history background check performed by Collin County prior to access being granted to Collin County facilities. Upon request, Vendor/Contractor/Provider shall provide list of individuals to the Collin County Purchasing Department within five (5) working days.
- 2.30 Non-Disclosure Agreement: Where applicable, vendor shall be required to sign a non-disclosure agreement acknowledging that all information to be furnished is in all respects confidential in nature, other than information which is in the public domain through other means and that any disclosure or use of same by vendor, except as provided in the contract/agreement, may cause serious harm or damage to Collin County. Therefore, Vendor agrees that Vendor will not use the information furnished for any purpose other than that stated in contract/agreement, and agrees that Vendor will not either directly or indirectly by agent, employee, or representative disclose this information, either in whole or in part, to any third party, except on a need to know basis for the purpose of evaluating any possible transaction. This agreement shall be binding upon Collin County and Vendor, and upon the directors, officers, employees and agents of each.
- 2.31 Vendors/Contractors/Providers must be in compliance with the Immigration and Reform Act of 1986 and all employees specific to this solicitation must be legally eligible to work in the United States of America.
- 2.32 Certification of Eligibility: This provision applies if the anticipated Contract exceeds \$100,000.00 and as it relates to the expenditure of federal grant funds. By submitting a bid or proposal in response to this solicitation, the Bidder certifies that at the time of submission, he/she is not on the Federal Government's list of suspended, ineligible, or debarred contractors. In the event of placement on the list between the time of bid/proposal submission and time of award, the Bidder will notify the Collin County Purchasing Agent. Failure to do so may result in terminating this contract for default.

2.33 Notice to Vendors/Contractors/Providers delivering goods or performing services within the Collin County Detention Facility: The Collin County Detention Facility houses persons who have been charged with and/or convicted of serious criminal offenses. When entering the Detention Facility, you could: (1) hear obscene or graphic language; (2) view partially clothed male inmates; (3) be subjected to verbal abuse or taunting; (4) risk physical altercations or physical contact, which could be minimal or possibly serious; (5) be exposed to communicable or infectious diseases; (6) be temporarily detained or prevented from immediately leaving the Detention Facility in the case of an emergency or "lockdown"; and (7) subjected to a search of your person or property. While the Collin County Sheriff's Office takes every reasonable precaution to protect the safety of visitors to the Detention Facility, because of the inherently dangerous nature of a Detention Facility and the type of the persons incarcerated therein, please be advised of the possibility of such situations exist and you should carefully consider such risks when entering the Detention Facility. By entering the Collin County Detention Facility, you acknowledge that you are aware of such potential risks and willingly and knowingly choose to enter the Collin County Detention Facility.

2.34 Delays and Extensions of Time when applicable:

- 2.34.1 If the Vendor/Contractor/Provider is delayed at any time in the commence or progress of the Work by an act or neglect of the Owner or Architect/Engineer, or of an employee of either, or of a separate contractor employed by the Owner, or by changes ordered in the Work, or by labor disputes, fire, unusual delay in deliveries, unavoidable casualties or other causes beyond the Vendor/Contractor/Provider's control, or by delay authorized by the Owner pending mediation and arbitration, or by other causes which the Owner or Architect/Engineer determines may justify delay, then the Contract Time shall be extended by Change Order for such reasonable time as the Owner/Architect may determine.
- 2.34.2 If adverse weather conditions are the basis for a Claim for additional time, such Claim shall be documented by data substantiating that weather conditions were abnormal for the period of time and could not have been reasonably anticipated, and that the weather conditions had an adverse effect on the scheduled construction.
- 2.35 Disclosure of Certain Relationships: Chapter 176 of the Texas Local Government Code requires that any vendor considering doing business with a local government entity disclose the vendor's affiliation or business relationship that might cause a conflict of interest with a local government entity. Subchapter 6 of the code requires a vendor to file a conflict of interest questionnaire (CIQ) if a conflict exists. By law this questionnaire must be filed with the records administrator of Collin County no later than the 7th business day after the date the vendor becomes aware of an event that requires the statement to be filed. A vendor commits an offense if the vendor knowingly violates the code. An offense under this section is a misdemeanor. By submitting a response to this request, the vendor represents that it is in compliance with the requirements of Chapter 176 of the Texas Local Government Code. Please send completed forms to the Collin County, County Clerk's Office located at 2300 Bloomdale Rd., Suite 2104, McKinney, TX 75071.
- 2.36 Disclosure of Interested Parties: Section 2252.908 of the Texas Government Code requires a business entity entering into certain contracts with a governmental entity to file with the governmental entity a disclosure of interested parties at the time the business entity submits the signed contract to the governmental entity. Section 2252.908 requires the disclosure form (Form 1295) to be signed by the authorized agent of the contracting business entity, acknowledging that the disclosure is made under oath and under penalty of perjury. Section 2252.908 applies only to a contract that requires an action or vote by the governing body of the governmental entity before the contract may be signed or has a value of at least \$1 million. Section 2252.908 provides definitions of certain terms occurring in the section. Section 2252.908 applies only to a contract entered into on or after January 1, 2016.
- 2.37 Vendors/Contractors/Providers must be in compliance with the provisions of Section 2252.152 and Section 2252.153 of the Texas Government Code which states, in part, contracts with companies engaged in business with Iran, Sudan, or Foreign Terrorist Organizations are prohibited. A governmental entity may not enter into a contract with a company that is listed on the Comptroller of the State of Texas website identified under Section 806.051, Section 807.051 or Section 2253.253 which do business with Iran, Sudan or any Foreign Terrorist Organization. This Act is effective September 1, 2017.

2.38 Force Majeure: No party shall be liable or responsible to the other party, nor be deemed to have defaulted under or breached this Agreement, for any failure or delay in fulfilling or performing any term of this Agreement, when and to the extent such failure or delay is caused by or results from acts beyond the affected party's reasonable control, including, without limitation: acts of God; flood, fire or explosion; war, invasion, riot or other civil unrest; actions, embargoes or blockades in effect on or after the date of this Agreement; or national or regional emergency (each of the foregoing, a "Force Majeure Event"). A party whose performance is affected by a Force Majeure Event shall give notice to the other party, stating the period of time the occurrence is expected to continue and shall use diligent efforts to end the failure or delay and minimize the effects of such Force Majeure Event.

NOTE: All other terms and conditions (i.e. Insurance Requirements, Bond Requirements, etc.) shall be stated in the individual IFB Solicitation documents as Special Terms, Conditions and Specifications.

3.0 INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

- 3.1 Before commencing work, the vendor shall be required, at its own expense, to furnish the Collin County Purchasing Agent with certified copies of all insurance certificate(s) indicating the coverage to remain in force throughout the term of this contract.
 - 3.1.1 **Commercial General Liability** insurance including but not limited to the coverage indicated below. Coverage shall not exclude or limit Products/Completed Operations, Contractual Liability, or Cross Liability. Coverage must be written on occurrence form.

- 3.1.3 Commercial Automobile Liability insurance which includes any automobile (owned, non-owned, and hired vehicles) used in connection with the contract.
 - Combined Single Limit Each Accident: \$1,000,000
- 3.1.4 **Professional/Errors & Omissions Liability** insurance with a two (2) year extended reporting period. If you choose to have project coverage endorsed onto your base policy, this would be acceptable.

• Each Occurrence/Aggregate: \$1,000,000

3.1.5 Umbrella/Excess Liability insurance.

• Each Occurrence/Aggregate: \$1,000,000

- 3.2 With reference to the foregoing insurance requirement, the vendor shall endorse applicable insurance policies as follows:
 - 3.2.1 A waiver of subrogation in favor of Collin County, its officials, employees, volunteers and officers shall be provided for General Liability, Commercial Automobile Liability, and Workers' Compensation.
 - 3.2.2 The vendor's insurance coverage shall name Collin County as additional insured under the General Liability policy.

- 3.2.3 All insurance policies shall be endorsed to require the insurer to immediately notify Collin County of any decrease in the insurance coverage limits.
- 3.2.4 All insurance policies shall be endorsed to the effect that Collin County will receive at least thirty (30) days notice prior to cancellation, non-renewal or termination of the policy.
- 3.2.5 All copies of Certificates of Insurance shall reference the project/contract number.
- 3.3 All insurance shall be purchased from an insurance company that meets the following requirements:
 - 3.3.1 A financial rating of A-VII or higher as assigned by the BEST Rating Company or equivalent.
- 3.4 Certificates of Insurance shall be prepared and executed by the insurance company or its authorized agent, and shall contain provisions representing and warranting the following:
 - 3.4.1 Sets forth all endorsements and insurance coverages according to requirements and instructions contained herein.
 - 3.4.2 Sets forth the notice of cancellation or termination to Collin County.

4.0 SPECIAL CONDITIONS AND SPECIFICATIONS

- 4.1 **Authorization:** By order of the Commissioners Court of Collin County, Texas, sealed bids will be received for Garage, Overhead, & Sliding Door Maintenance & Repairs, IFB 2022-160.
- 4.2 **Purpose:** The intended purpose for this invitation for Bid is to solicit qualified vendors for Collin County to cover the anticipated maintenance, labor/parts, and equipment cost for the maintenance and repairs of garage/overhead and sliding doors for all Collin County buildings and facilities on an as needed basis.
- 4.3 **Term:** Provide for a term contract commencing on date of award and continuing for one (1) year, with the option to renew for three (3) additional one (1) year periods.
- 4.4 **Funding:** Funds for payment have been provided through the Collin County budget approved by the Commissioners Court for this fiscal year only. State of Texas statutes prohibit the County from any obligation of public funds beyond the fiscal year for which a budget has been approved. Therefore, anticipated orders or other obligations that may arise past the end of the current Collin County fiscal year shall be subject to budget approval.
- 4.5 **Price Reduction:** If during the life of the contract, the Contractor's net prices to its customers for the same product(s) and/or services shall be reduced below the contracted price, it is understood and agreed that the County shall receive such price reduction.
- A price Re-determination: The bidder is to submit a bid that will be fixed for (6) months. A price re-determination may be considered by Collin County only at each of the 6-month intervals of the contract. At each 6-month interval of the contract, the Contractor may request a price re-determination in their bid, dependent upon price fluctuations for material. All requests for price redetermination shall be in written form, and shall include documents supporting price redetermination such as Manufacturer's direct cost, postage rates, Railroad Commission rates, Federal/State minimum wage law, Federal/State unemployment taxes, F.I.C.A., Insurance Coverage Rates, etc. Collin County reserves the right to accept or reject any/all of the price re-determination as it deems to be in the best interest of the County. If the request is submitted and received within the required time frame, upon verification of documentation and approval by Purchasing, the adjustment will be submitted to Commissioners Court for approval. Contractor will be notified in writing upon approval.

Should a contractor fail to submit the request and supporting documentation to the proper location at least thirty (30) days ahead of the next 6-month interval, contractor shall be deemed to have waived its right to any redetermination in price.

4.6.1 The anniversary date will be the day the contract was awarded by Commissioners Court of each year. The 'base' month for determining adjustments will be the sixth (6th) month prior to the anniversary date of the contract. The base month is fixed and will not be adjusted year to year. The adjustments will be based on the

difference in the base month for each applicable year and will become effective on the first day of the anniversary month.

- 4.7 **Approximate usage:** Approximate usage does not constitute an order, but only implies the probably quantity Collin County will use. Services will be ordered on an as-needed basis.
- 4.8 **Approximate Value:** The annual estimated value of this contract is \$40,000.
- 4.9 **Certificate of Insurance:** The Contractor shall post with Owner, not later than ten (10) consecutive calendar days of Collin County Commissioners Court award of Contract, a Certificate of Insurance in accordance with Section 3.0.
- 4.10 **Evaluation and Award:** Award of the contract shall be made to the responsive bidder(s) who submits the lowest and best bid meeting specifications. The County reserves the right to award bid in whole or by line item as the County deems in its best interest. Collin County further reserves the right to a secondary awarded Contractor for this contract.
 - 4.10.1 In the best interest of the County, Collin County further reserves the right on an asneeded basis to obtain another Contractor outside of the original contract for maintenance or repairs in order to meet and comply with County requirements should the primary and secondary Contractor be unable to respond or fulfill services as needed.

The bidder's past experience of honoring contracts at the bid price, as well as their past service history with Collin County, will be an important consideration in the evaluation of the lowest and best bid.

Bidders may be asked to submit additional references and evidence of possession of such equipment and tools as may be needed to perform all work in an expeditious, safe and satisfactory manner. Bidders failing to provide the information necessary for the evaluation of the bid, including licenses and certifications, may be considered non-responsive.

4.11 **Qualifications:**

- 4.11.1 All bidders shall have three (3) year's minimum experience repairing garage/overhead and sliding doors.
- 4.11.2 Contractor shall have the ability to provide trained and experienced technicians knowledgeable and capable of diagnosing and repair problems with various types of garage/overhead and sliding doors including, but not limited to the following:
 - 4.11.2.1 Garage/overhead door manual/automatic
 - 4.11.2.2 Sliding door manual/automatic
 - 4.11.2.3 Track door manual/automatic
 - 4.11.2.4 Rollup door manual/automatic

- 4.11.3 Contractor shall have sufficient personnel and equipment required to perform services in a timely and professional manner.
- 4.11.4 Contractor shall have the ability to perform all work safely and efficiently and in accordance the industry's highest standards.
- 4.12 **Subcontractors:** Contractor shall state names of all subcontractors and the type of work they will be performing. If a Contractor fails to specify a subcontractor, then the Contractor shall be deemed to have agreed to be fully qualified to perform the contract without a subcontractor, and that the Contractor will fully perform the requirements of the contract.

No Contractor whose bid is accepted shall (a) substitute any subcontractor, or (b) permit a subcontract to be voluntarily assigned or transferred or allow it to be performed by anyone other than the original subcontractor listed in the original bid without approval in writing from the Collin County Purchasing Department.

The successful Contractor further agrees that Collin County and its agents, servants and employees shall not be liable for any loss or damage resulting from personal injury, physical loss, harassment of or discrimination against employee or other violations of the provisions of this contract occasioned by the acts or omissions of the successful Contractor's sub-contractors, their agents or employees. The indemnification provisions of this contract shall apply to all sub-contractors

4.13 **Background Checks:** Once awarded the contract, a mandatory background check performed by Collin County will be required for all persons who will work onsite.

4.14 Repair Response Time:

- 4.14.1 Standard hours of work shall be 7:00 a.m. through 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday excluding Collin County recognized holidays.
- 4.14.2 Non-standard hours shall be all hours outside the standard hours listed above including Collin County recognized holidays.
- 4.14.3 The company shall have a minimum technical staff of two (2) people and shall be capable of responding to a service problem within four (4) hours from time of call.
- 4.14.4 If the primary awarded Contractor is not able to respond within the required time constraint, the County has the option to notify a secondary awarded Contractor or another Contractor to complete service.
- 4.14.5 Time shall begin once the technician(s) arrives at the Collin County work site. There will be no charges for travel to and from the work site. Any overtime hours must be pre-approved by Collin County Facilities prior to work being done in order for overtime pay to be approved to be paid by Collin County.

4.14.6 Contractor shall notify designated Collin County Facilities department personnel upon arriving at the repair location.

4.15 Parts and Service:

- 4.15.1 Maintenance and repair work and/or parts will be ordered as needed and shall be billed on a time and materials basis at the rates awarded in this contract.
- 4.15.2 Payment to the Contractor for parts used on each service will be reimbursed at actual cost, plus a percentage, provided Contractor's invoice relative to such purchase is attached to the Contractor's billing invoice.
- 4.15.3 There will be no minimum charge on parts and labor.
- 4.15.4 All work performed shall be in accordance with all applicable statutes, ordinances, codes, or regulation of Federal, State and Local Authorities having jurisdiction in effect.
- 4.15.5 Any and all work completed by the Contractor shall be reviewed and deemed acceptable by a member of Collin County Facilities Maintenance Department prior to payment. Work found non-compliant shall be remedied by the Contractor at their own expense.
- 4.15.6 Additional repairs required due to faulty equipment provided and installed by the Contractor, improper procedures, and/or Contractor's negligence or error shall be the responsibility of the Contractor.
- 4.15.7 All equipment that is removed/replaced is the property of Collin County. Contractor shall return all removed equipment to Facilities Maintenance.
- 4.15.8 Upon completion of each job, Contractor shall restore the work site to its former condition and remove any surplus and waste materials from the site.
- 4.15.9 Upon completion of each job, Contractor shall be responsible for cleanup of debris and spills resulting from work completed while completing services.
- 4.15.10 Contractor shall not use Collin County dumpsters or receptacles to dispose of any refuse.
- 4.15.11 For any project with a cost of over \$500.00, Contractor must contact the designated Collin County Facilities personnel to obtain proper approval prior to making repairs.

- 4.15.12 Collin County reserves the right to prepare a scope of work and require a quote from the Contractor with a complete breakdown of material and labor costs. If required, Contractor agrees to provide pertinent bonds for each job quote.
- 4.15.13 The County further reserves the right to supply all or part of the materials on any project.
- 4.15.14 Collin County reserves the right to add/delete new equipment/systems as the County deems in its best interest.

4.16 Warranty:

- 4.16.1 Services provided by the Contractor shall be covered and warranted by the service contractor without direct Collin County subrogation.
- 4.16.2 The Contractor guarantees that all service and repairs provided shall be performed in a workmanlike manner. Any claim for defective workmanship will be provided to the Contractor by written notice. The Contractor agrees to remedy and redo any such service(s) in a timely manner without cost to the County. The Contractor also warrants against defects in materials, and workmanship of all the Contractor parts or components supplied hereunder from date of installation. If any part(s) or component(s) should prove defective during the aforementioned warranty period, the Contractor will at its option repair and replace any such items provided they were not damaged, abused or affected by chemical properties. THIS WARRANTY IS IN LIEU OF ALL OTHER WARRANTIES, EXPRESS, IMPLIED OR **STATUTORY INCLUDING** THE **IMPLIED WARRANTIES** MERCHANTABILITY AND FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE. The Contractor's obligation to repair, replace or perform a service, on any defective part(s), component(s) or service shall be owner's exclusive remedy.
- 4.16.3 Warranty period should be stated on each invoice.

4.17 Payment:

- 4.17.1 Any and all work completed by the Contractor shall be reviewed and deemed acceptable by a member of the Collin County Facilities department prior to payment. Work found non-compliant with project plans and specification shall be remedied by the Contractor at its own expense.
- 4.17.2 Original invoices must be sent to the Collin County Auditor, 2300 Bloomdale Rd., Suite 3100, McKinney, TX 75071, email accountspayable@collincountytx.gov. Copies of all invoices must also be sent to Facilities Maintenance, 4600 Community Ave., McKinney, TX 75071.
- 4.17.3 Invoices must have breakdown by technicians, parts and supplies used on the job and include the purchase order number.

4.18 Technical Specifications:

- 4.18.1 Contractor is to include all labor, fuel, delivery, freight, service call costs, and parts/material costs when providing pricing for items relating to preventive maintenance.
- 4.18.2 Contractor is to include all labor, fuel, delivery, travel, and service call costs when providing pricing for hourly rates for repair and parts.
- 4.18.3 Preventive maintenance for garage/overhead & sliding door is to include the following services at a minimum, and on an as needed basis:

4.18.3.9	Inspect door locks for proper operation
4.18.3.10	Inspect and tighten door fasteners, operator sprockets, hinges, hardware, and shaft collars
4.18.3.11	Inspect and lubricate operator roller chain, door chain hoist, rollers, and all bearings
4.18.3.12	Inspect and level door alignment
4.18.3.13	Inspect and adjust all photocells
4.18.3.14	Check the operator gear reducer for oil leakage on electrically operated doors; add oil if needed
4.18.3.15	Check the tension of the roller chain between the operator and the door sprocket and adjust as needed
4.18.3.16	Oil the interior roller chain on operators without gear reducer
