There are many ways in which analysis will collect and disseminate information, including the following: Requests for Information-These may include criminal histories, backgrounds, employment histories, photo line-ups, phone toll analyses, threat assessments, open source analyses, and link analyses; Investigative actions-These may include BOLOs (Be on the Lookout), Officer Safety Bulletins, Attempt to Locate/Wanted Persons, and Suspect Profiles; Intelligence gathering-These may include Situational Awareness Bulletins, Potential Threat Advisors, and Source Detail Requests; Assessments-These may include Special Event Threat Assessments and Facility Security Assessments.
