2. General Discussion Items:

Presentation, discussion and any action regarding:

a. AI-55905 Regional Transportation Council monthly update, Commissioner, Precinct 4.

Commissioner Webb updated the Court on the monthly RTC (Regional Transportation Council) meeting. He said the Board approved the 2025-2028 TIP (Transportation Improvement Plan) which has funding of \$9.06 billion dollars for the three-year period. The TIP is comprised of 1,282 active projects and 78 implementing agencies including Collin County. He said the first item of interest to the County was improvements to a section of US 380 east of McKinney spanning through Farmersville and Spur 399.

Commissioner Webb said he believed the funding set for US 380 was for engineering and right of way acquisition. He said the TIP also included improvements to US 75 from Allen to McKinney, Dallas North Tollway, and Park Boulevard. The last item of interest from the Director's report involved a segment of the high-speed rail between Fort Worth and Dallas, which is currently in environmental clearance. Cara Mendelsohn, City of Dallas Councilmember, presented a resolution to the RTC to have the high-speed rail go underground as it entered downtown Dallas. This resolution was unanimously adopted by the RTC.

Judge Hill said in the Council's comments, support for the Dallas to Fort Worth segment of high-speed rail depended on the construction of the Dallas to Houston segment. He asked Commissioner Webb if there would be a hold on the Dallas to Fort Worth segment as a result of this stipulation.

Commissioner Webb said he suspected it would go all the way through environmental clearance but was unsure if would go any further than that. He also said it would not make sense to complete the Dallas to Fort Worth segment unless there was already clearance for the Dallas to Houston segment.

Commissioner Webb said the RTC elected new officers. The new Chair is Dallas County Judge, Clay Jenkins, the Vice Chair is Johnson County Commissioner, Rick Bailey, and the Secretary is Lewisville City Councilmember, Brandon Jones. (Time: 1:36 p.m.)
