Justification:

Law enforcement admin have historically driven unmarked units to provide a minimal presence. Just as plain clothes and monogrammed polo's tend to de-escalate our contact with the public, unmarked units allow deputy constables to conduct operations covertly, discreetly and effectively. Should the need for greater presence be necessary lights and siren are available.

*Additional remarks of justification for Pct 2 unmarked units:

- 1. Unmarked units allow constables to conduct operations with greater sensitivity while executing civil instruments and criminal warrants.
- 2. Unmarked units provide flexibility. The ability to blend into the environment or activate lights and siren in an emergency to stand out and provide an element of surprise.
- 3. Law enforcement department heads historically utilize unmarked vehicles to maintain a professional appearance without drawing unnecessary attention.

The use of unmarked units serves to enhance operational effectiveness and comply with legal requirements in the constables duties to the public. From handling legal documents, executing warrants and protecting the public the flexibility of these units underscore the commitment to professionalism in constable operations. They have served this administration well over the years!

**Additional remarks for Pct 2 Take-Home Units "home storage":

- 1. These deputies work outside of a regular schedule to effect service when the defendant is most likely to be home, including nights, early mornings and weekends (split shift modified). The only practical way for this kind of work is with a Take-Home unit.
- 2. The urgency nature of Protective Orders, Restraining Orders, Writs (in general and attachments) require immediate responses outside normal business hours. Timely responses to execute at a moment's notice makes it critical to home store the unit.
- 3. Each officer in this precinct lives on the east side of State Hwy 78, as do I. Sometimes we respond to calls from dispatch (or "On View") as the closest law enforcement to those rural settings (i.e. loose livestock, auto accidents, shootings etc.) as we travel to and from our residence in our Take-Home unit.

- 3. Specialized Assignments: Certain roles within the constable office, such as those assigned to an elected officials for administrative or management duties, may require unmarked vehicles to ensure mobility and security without drawing unnecessary attention. This helps in maintaining a professional appearance and protecting individuals who may be targets of threats or undue attention.
- 4. Handling Valuables or Sensitive Materials: In cases involving large amounts of cash (e.g., writs of execution/order of sales), unmarked units offer a secure means of transport. They reduce the risk of attracting unwanted attention or potential threats, thereby ensuring the safety of both personnel and assets.
- 5. Legal and Procedural Considerations: In accordance with specific laws and regulations, such as Health and Safety Code 574.045 (e) concerning mental health warrants, unmarked units may be mandated or recommended for use to comply with legal procedures while safeguarding the privacy and dignity of individuals involved.
- 6. Discreet Operations: When Constables use unmarked vehicles, community members may feel less intimidated and more willing to interact positively with law enforcement.

In summary, the use of unmarked units serves to enhance operational effectiveness, ensure security, and comply with legal requirements in various constable and official contexts. Each situation outlined (from handling legal documents and executing warrants to protecting public officials and managing sensitive materials) underscores the importance of discretion, security, and professionalism in constable operations.
