2. General Discussion Items:

Presentation, discussion and any action regarding:

a. AI-56746 Foreclosed property sales location, County Judge.

Yoon Kim, County Administrator, asked the Court to consider moving the location of the public sales auction of foreclosed properties from the Administration building to the courthouse. The current construction of the Healthcare building next to the Administration building has reduced the number of available parking spots by 23%. The increased traffic during the monthly foreclosure auctions would exceed parking capacity limits.

Mr. Kim said he discussed the potential impact of this change with District Clerk, Michael Gould. Mr. Gould and Sergeant Holcomb, Courthouse Security, confirmed relocating the auction to the courthouse would not interfere with jury panel activities which are also conducted on the first Tuesday of the month.

A motion was made to move the foreclosure properties auction location to the courthouse. (Time 1:34 p.m.)

Commissioner Webb briefly reviewed highlights from the recent RTC (Regional Transportation Council) meeting. The workshop included drafting the RTC Legislative Program and a consultant's recommendations for Transit 2.0.

Prior to the workshop, Commissioner Webb attended a meeting in Austin where the Texas Transportation Commission approved their UTP (Unified Transportation Plan). The UTP included a Category 12 allocation of \$747M to fund future development of US 380 and Spur 399. Commissioner Webb further shared preliminary timeframes for work on these projects.

Judge Hill asked if Court involvement would be needed in matters related to Transit 2.0. Commissioner Webb recommended waiting until after consultant recommendations and legislative proposals were addressed by the affected cities. Afterward, the Court could offer input on rural transit areas affected by Transit 2.0.
