Judge Hill said the City of Farmersville indicated that unless Collin County was prepared to spend more on fire services, they would withdraw from the Fire Service Agreement. Collin County staff reached out to the City of Allen to see if they would allow Collin County employees, who live within the City of Allen, to have complementary access to their recreation center in exchange for Parks and Open Space bond funds. Commissioner Fletcher said she does not think it is appropriate to use bond funds for County staff benefit when they are intended to be used for all County citizens. Commissioner Hale said he understands Commissioner Fletcher's concerns; however, other projects are being selected that only benefit specific cities. He further stated Farmersville is approaching the Fire Service issue the right way by collaborating with the County on finding the best solution. Commissioner Fletcher said she would like the Court to consider Collin County projects when discussing the utilization of the Bond Funds. Commissioner Webb said he would be interested in entering into an interlocal agreement with all of the cities in Collin County and see what it would cost for County employees to be members at their recreational facilities.
