b. AI-57386 89th Legislative Session Update, Administrative Services.

Russell Schaffner, Deputy County Administrator, updated the judge and commissioners on several bills moving through the legislature. He noted that the House committees would announce community assignments soon and that committee numbers would be reduced due to new rules. He highlighted HB2085, which would require TDCJ (Texas Department of Criminal Justice) to pick up inmates within one day after their case is disposed, along with compensation for delays. Schaffner also mentioned HB1031, which would allow judges to set salaries for court coordinators and administrators, bypassing the County Commissioners' Court.

Commissioner Webb opposed HB1031, expressing concerns about unequal pay models and lack of oversight. Schaffner concluded by mentioning upcoming Senate hearings on bail reform bills, which are expected to be more vigorous than last session. (Time: 1:43 p.m.)


3. Executive Session Items:

The Court did not recess into Executive Session.


Public Comments not related to an item on the Agenda.

Chuck Reynolds, McKinney, requested that the Court implement hand-marked paper ballots for the November 2025 election due to security concerns with electronic voting systems. He cited a Georgia hearing and a Michigan study showing that voters failed to detect errors on BMDs (Ballot Marking Devices), with detection rates as low as 7%. Mr. Reynolds urged the Court to discontinue BMDs and adopt hand-marked paper ballots for the 2025 election. (Time: 1:46 p.m.)


There being no further business of the Court, Judge Hill adjourned the meeting at 1:46 p.m.





Susan Fletcher, Commissioner, Pct 1
