Commissioner Hale expressed concern over the City of McKinney's request for a \$125 million loan for utility movements, pointing out the lack of formal requests from the city regarding other support needed from the County for issues like animal services, fire services and roads. He emphasized that either the cities and County were working together in partnership or they were not. Commissioner Hale suggested holding the decision for one to two weeks to allow for further discussions with the city to clarify expectations.

Commissioner Webb acknowledged the importance of the \$8 billion mobility project, which was the County's top priority, and did not want to cause a delay. However, he agreed to a one to two week delay to address Commissioner Hale's concerns. Commissioner Fletcher supported moving forward with the project but emphasized that Commissioner Hale's concerns are valid and need to be addressed. Commissioner Williams suggested that the financial requests from various cities be better quantified for clarity.

The Court agreed to hold the item for two weeks, to allow time to facilitate further discussions with the city to resolve the issues and improve communication before proceeding. (Time: 1:40 p.m.)

2. General Discussion Items:

a. <u>AI-57612</u> Budget amendment from the District Clerk's Passport budget to the Sheriff's Office overtime budget to cover security staffing needed during the Passport Fair, District Clerk.

Michael Gould, District Clerk, requested a budget amendment to transfer unused funds from the passport budget to the SO (Sheriff's Office) to cover security expenses at the courthouse for the passport fair scheduled for Saturday, March 15, 2025. Mr. Gould explained that the SO would provide security, but since this was not part of their regular budget, it would require overtime pay. The available budget was \$7,939, but the actual overtime cost was expected to be much lower.

Judge Hill asked for a not-to-exceed number for the amendment. Mr. Gould agreed to provide a figure based on the \$7,939 available, clarifying that the funding would only cover this one event, as future passport fairs would be planned for the new budget cycle. Judge Hill expressed concerns about the SO receiving overtime pay while Mr. Gould's staff, who were required to work, would not. Mr. Gould explained that his staff would use comp time instead of overtime due to budget limitations. The Court agreed to approve the budget amendment for the event with a not-to-exceed amount of \$7,900, while emphasizing that the actual cost would be tracked and adjusted as necessary. b. AI-57386 89th Legislative Session Update, Administrative Services.

Russell Schaffner, Deputy County Administrator, informed the Court about a new bill concerning homelessness services, which would require counties with populations over 1.3 million to handle homeless services. While Collin County's population was currently under this threshold, its rapid growth could push it over by 2030. He also discussed bills including SB 1557 and SB 985 addressing changes related to transportation funding as well as voting precinct issues.

The homelessness bill would require counties to manage crisis services and housing without additional state or federal funding, potentially increasing property taxes to cover the costs. Judge Hill expressed concerns about the financial burden this could place on counties, especially as the state pushes to reduce property taxes. Mr. Schaffner highlighted that Collin County could soon fall into the 1.3 million-population bracket, making it essential to monitor this bill closely in the future. The Court agreed to continue tracking the bill and its potential impact on the county's budget.
